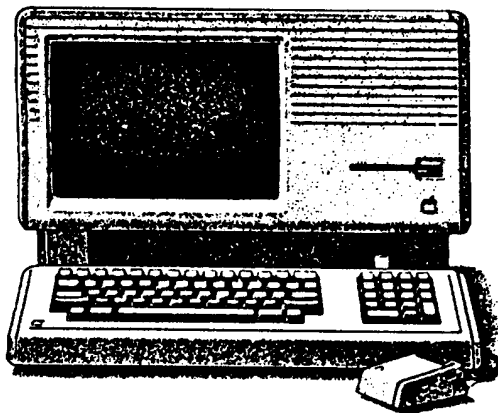

INTRODUCTION

The Scrapbook tool is a Lisa program that transfers Macintosh scrapbook data between the Lisa and the Macintosh. This program was written by Apple Computer when Apple discontinued the Lisa in favor of the Macintosh and needed a data migration facility.

The Scrapbook tool was an internal R & D tool for Apple which served as a foundation for the publically released Lisa-to-Macintosh tool (Note: LTM only transferred data from the Lisa to the Macintosh, not vice versa, alas).

Larry Rosenstein of Apple wrote the Scrapbook tool.

The View menus controls several aspects of what you see on the screen. \L \L "Next Page" and "Previous Page" allow you to move forward and backward through the scrapbook. These menu commands have the same effect as using the 2 arrow buttons. \L \L "Show as on Lisa" and "Show as on Macintosh" allow you to view pictures as they would appear on the desired machine. When "Show as on Macintosh" is in effect, pictures are stretched horizontally to account for the differences between the Lisa and Macintosh screen. These menu commands have the same effect as checking the corresponding box in the status area.

PHRASE # 5002 <Kind \$F00>

The Source menu allows you to choose the particular scrapbook you want to view. \L \L "Personal Scrapbook" selects the scrapbook that is stored on your Lisa. \L \L "Micro diskette" selects the scrapbook on a Macintosh-format micro diskette (if one has been inserted in the disk drive). \L \L "Hard Disk" selects the scrapbook on a partitioned hard disk. This is limited to the internal hard disk or the disk attached to the parallel connector.

Known Bugs: \L \L The program does not gracefully recover from running out of space while writing to a Macintosh disk, or from trying to write to a micro diskette that is write-protected. \L \L There are problems with transferring pictures between LisaDraw and MacDraw. (Line thicknesses, text fonts, etc. may change.) \L \L There are some user interface issues that need to be resolved. (Suggestions to improve the user interface are especially appreciated.) \L \L If you stretch a picture with the Stretching menu, its new size will not be stored on the disk.

Recent Changes: \L \L Error messages will now report some numbers to indicate what went wrong. \L \L The functionality for transferring information in both directions has been implemented. \L \L You probably do not need to use the Stretching menu or the "Show as on ..." commands. (Try ignoring these commands and see if there are situations the program does not handle correctly.) \L \L

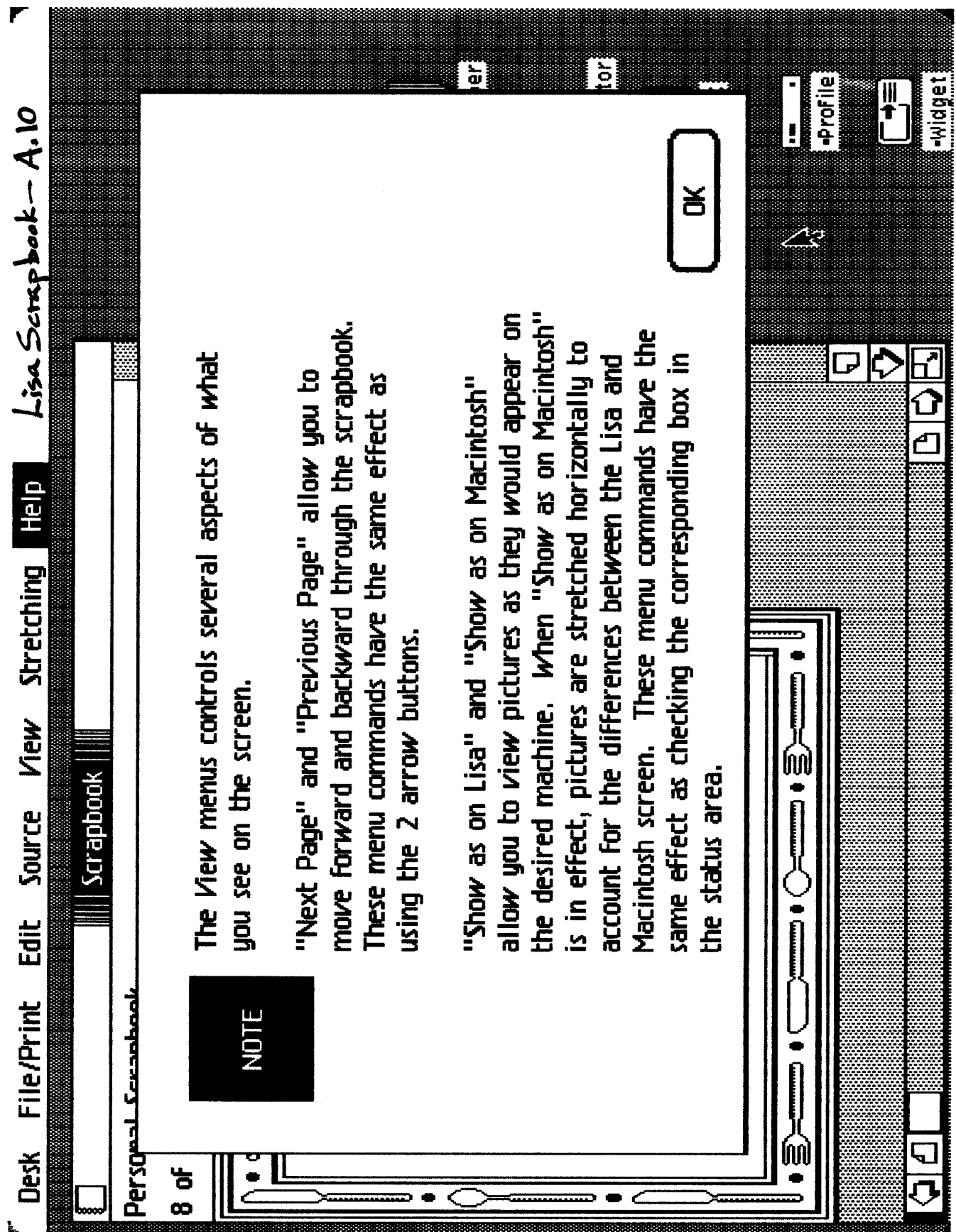
"Personal Scrapbook" selects the scrapbook that is stored on your Lisa.

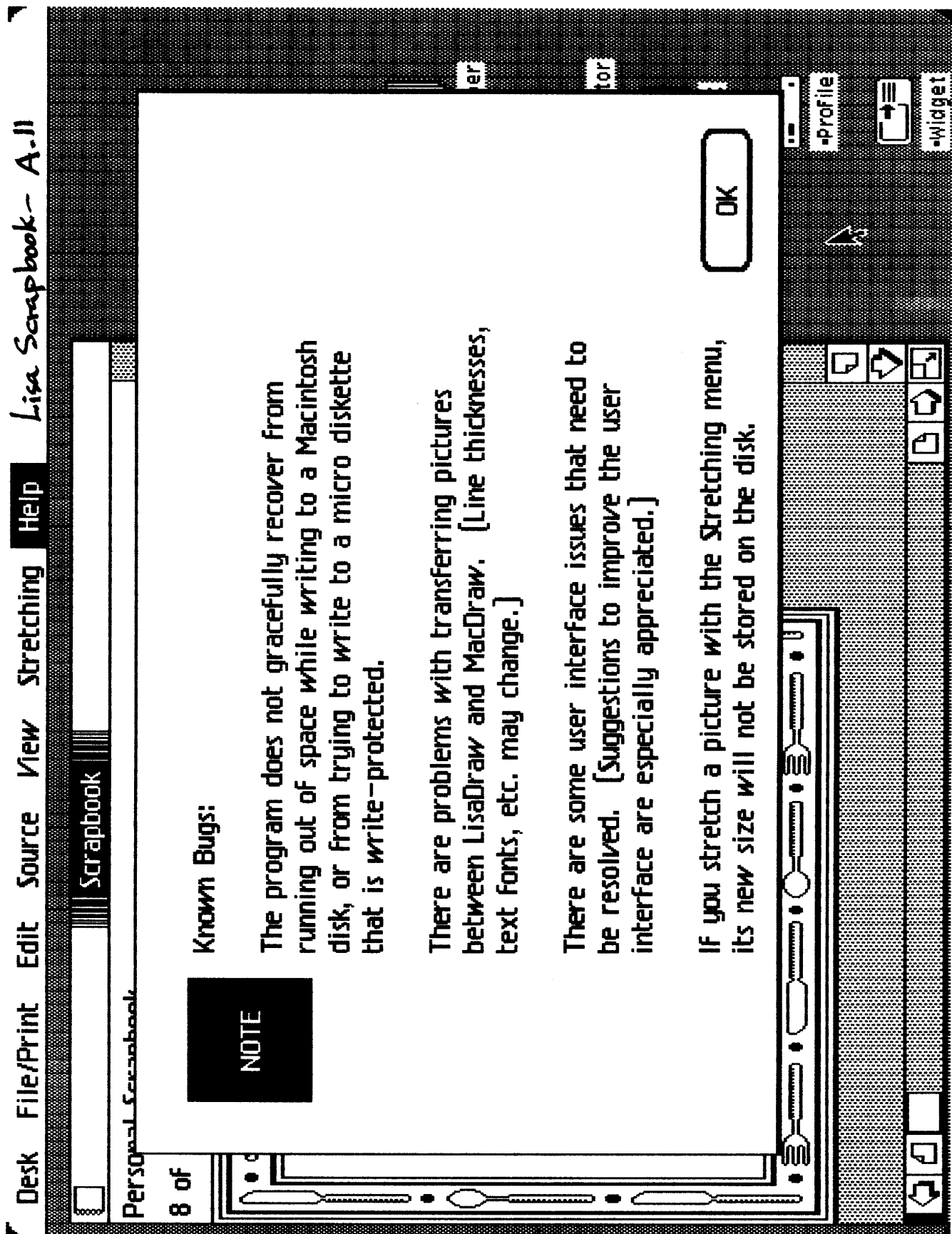
"Micro diskette" selects the scrapbook on a Macintosh-format micro diskette [if one has been inserted in the disk drive].
