# Text-Based Software: An Endangered Species?



based programs, such as BusinessWorks, which employ the wonderful AppleWorks file-folder interface.

Not good enough, you say, because you can't use your mouse? Then look deeper and discover other text-based gems that use the Apple II's unique MouseText character set. Examples include MouseWriter, MouseTalk, MouseFiler 2.0, MagnaCharta and even Apple's new AppleLink Personal Edition. All of these programs run fine on the Apple II GS and use the mouse, but none of them need color or sound to crunch numbers and deliver effective results.

The point of all this is rather simple. The Apple II GS, which represents the latest in a long line of Apple II models, has access to a rich and diverse software heritage. Much of that heritage, especially in the area of productivity programs, is text based. Moreover, many of these programs run faster and may in fact be easier on the eyes than their more flashy and bit-mapped brethren.

With these advantages clearly in the text-based camp, one might expect to find a fair share of development resources aimed at text-mode software. One might even hope to see the development of text-based programs that run exclusively on the Apple II GS and exploit its superior 16-bit operation.

All of this is in the realm of possibility, but not probability. The reason: Apple Computer, Inc. has chosen to put its considerable resources behind developers who embrace the Human Interface Guidelines, bit-mapped graphics, the Finder and the new GS/OS operating system. Those who don't do likewise may find themselves out in the cold.

Apple is correct to promote standards, but it may be taking a short-sided approach in the II GS market. After all, the AppleWorks file-folder "standard" and MouseText "standard" predate the II GS. Both have proven themselves extremely robust, from a marketing and productivity standpoint. To abandon them now by endorsing bit-mapped programs exclusively is doing everyone a disservice.

After all, isn't the Apple II supposed to be anything you want it to be? ■

# AppleFest Update: The San Francisco Story

*The most recent AppleFest showcased a brand new IIGS operating system and a whole lot more.*

**A**ppleFest is the Woodstock of the Apple II community, a safe haven from the cluttered computer business, the only place where an Apple IIGS user can go shop, look and evaluate hardware and software aimed specifically at his or her computer.

True enough, the Apple IIGS needs to share the AppleFest spotlight with the other Apple II models in the family. At the Fall AppleFest in San Francisco, for example, Apple Computer, Inc. unveiled the Apple IIc+, a faster version of the original 8-bit Apple that sports a built-in power supply and an 800K, 3.5-inch disk drive.


Still, the Fall AppleFest (September 16 to 18) generated plenty of interesting news for the IIGS user. What follows is a wrap-up of some of the more intriguing IIGS highlights.

**New System Software.** The one announcement that all IIGS users should cheer about is the release of a true 16-bit operating system for the Apple IIGS. Apple's new System Software Version 4.0 package includes GS/OS, a new operating system that finally taps the real power of the 65C816 microprocessor. In so doing, it speeds up boot time, disk access time and program launch time.

GS/OS features better support of hard disk drives and CD-ROM applications, compatibility with most (but not all) existing ProDOS 16 applications and several helpful utilities, such as easy partitioning of hard disk drives. Some programs may require minor modifications to run under GS/OS, but until the changes are made by their developers, all applications will run as usual with earlier versions of the system software.

The entire package with documentation sells for \$39, although Apple is encouraging efforts to make the software available free of charge from Apple dealers and other sources. A comprehensive look at GS/OS and the new Finder will appear in the next issue of *The Apple IIGS Buyer's Guide*.

**Show Stoppers.** Given the runaway success of AppleWorks, IIGS users took special interest in the announcement of AppleWorks



*"Stacks" of sound, text and graphics continue and connect for creativity.*


GS from Claris Corp. First previewed earlier this year as GS Works from Houston-based StyleWare, Inc., this power-packed integrated program was acquired by Claris and should be shipping (\$299 retail) by the time this article appears in print.

Despite a few bugs that reared themselves in sporadic software crashes, AppleWorks GS looks impressive and will be regularly featured in a new column in this magazine called "Inside AppleWorks GS." The first installment appears in this issue.

The recent interest in HyperCard on the Macintosh began to infect the IIGS community at AppleFest, thanks to the preview of HyperStudio from Roger Wagner Publishing, Inc. Although it won't ship until later this year, HyperStudio has the same "look and feel" as HyperCard, allowing users to create hypermedia applications using super-high-resolution graphics and digitized sound files from most existing sound boards. A bonus: Digitizing sound hardware and a microphone will be included as part of this \$129.95 package, allowing users to add their own voices or sound effects to stacks as they're created.

Also new from Roger Wagner: The Graphic Exchange, which is a \$49.95 utility for converting virtually any Macintosh or Apple II graphics file to a super-high-resolution IIGS image.

**Desktop Publishing.** Second-generation desktop publishing software was in full flower at AppleFest. Packages designed specifically for the IIGS included Medley from Milliken Publishing Co. (\$199 retail) and GraphicWrit-

er 3.0, a new version from distributor Seven Hills Software. The latter was available for previewing, but not quite ready for shipping.

As IIGS-specific software continues to evolve, new versions of leading 8-bit packages are becoming increasingly impressive and run well on the Apple IIGS. Both Publish It! 2.0 from Timeworks, Inc. (\$129.95) and Springboard Publisher 2.0 from Springboard Software, Inc. (\$139.95) seem faster and better equipped than their predecessors.

**Education.** Graphics and sound, the twin hallmarks of the Apple IIGS, seem better exploited in the latest educational packages. The IIGS versions of Reading And Me and Math And Me (both \$49.95 from Davidson & Associates, Inc.) use digitized speech for a clear and friendly instructional "voice."

Meanwhile, Weekly Reader Software from Optimum Resource, Inc. announced The New Talking Stickybear Alphabet, a new version of this best-seller that teaches uppercase and lowercase letters.

Cartooners and Puppeteers (both \$59.95) from Electronic Arts were announced and should be shipping by December. Designed for children ages 4 to 12, both products use sound effects, music and IIGS super-high-resolution graphics.

Another strong graphics-based program called Jigsaw! was demonstrated by Britannica Software. Available now under GS/OS, Jigsaw! (\$39.95) presents users with scrambled super-high-resolution jigsaw puzzles. The program should provide loads of entertainment and educational fun for entire families.

Software doesn't have to be IIGS-specific to be good. A case in point is the new "lapware" line from Tom Snyder Productions. The line is prereading software for toddlers that encourages teamwork between parent and child. *Jack And The Beanstalk* and *Flodd, The Bad Guy* (\$34.95 each) run across the Apple II family, which means they don't support super-high-resolution graphics. Judging by videotaped reactions from preschoolers, toddlers care more about interacting with parents than fancy graphics and space-age sound.

**Productivity.** Several new Apple II productivity packages proved that they don't have to be IIGS specific to be worth using on a IIGS. Leading AppleWorks add-on vendor Beagle Bros. demonstrated a handful of new AppleWorks additions, including TimeOut SpreadTools (\$59.95 retail) for "linking" spreadsheet cell values and GS Font Editor (\$49.95 retail) for making changes to any GS-type font.

*MagnaCharta* 3.0, another program compatible across the Apple II family, was also demonstrated at AppleFest. A data graphing package, *MagnaCharta* features one of the nicest mouse-driven interfaces around and retails for \$59.95. Its vendor, Third Wave Technology, Inc., also showed off its *VeriClean II* disk drive cleaning kit and software designed specifically for safely swabbing both 5.25- and 3.5-inch disk drives. The kit retails for \$19.95.

**Hardware.** Few big hardware breakthroughs graced this AppleFest, but several products still managed to stand out from the crowd. Among them was *SoundAce*, a little audio digitizer from Parallax, Inc. that comes with some pretty impressive IIGS cut-and-paste software, all for \$44.95.

At the higher end of the scale, Applied Engineering demonstrated two sound products that should be shipping by Christmas: *Sonic Blaster* (\$129 retail), which allows recording from external sources, and *Audio Animator* (\$239 retail), which does everything that *Sonic Blaster* does and has a MIDI (musical instrument digital interface). Both products employ advanced super-high-resolution software.

In the modem department, Epic Technology, Inc. uncovered the latest 2,400-baud modem in its line: the 2400 MINI. A little larger than a pack of cigarettes, the 2400 MINI uses the IIGS serial port and fits easily into a briefcase for on-the-go computing.

Several new and larger hard disk drive systems were on display, and each system should work nicely with the enhanced parti-

tioning offered by GS/OS. Among the fastest: First Class Peripherals' D9 Turbo, which is a giant 87 MB drive with an average access time of a mere 18 milliseconds. It's pricey — \$1,695 retail — but its vendor also offers smaller, less expensive units.

**Animation.** Although it wasn't shipping at the time of the show, *Art & Film Director* from Epyx seems to have all the makings of a hit product. The program (\$79.95 retail) combines both paint and animation features, two canvases and cel animation — a technique for animating drawings without having to redraw each image from scratch.

*Art & Film Director* will record on a VCR, save images to disk and print them out.

**Programming.** It doesn't take long for IIGS programmers to discover the limits of Applesoft, the built-in Basic that has remained virtually unchanged since the Apple II+ days. Fortunately, several vendors are championing new Basics that truly tap the IIGS' 16-bit memory and power.

One of the most visible vendors at AppleFest — thanks to its rocket-shaped balloon — was Micol Systems, a Canadian firm that launched *Micol Advanced BASIC* for the

Apple IIGS. The language uses Pascal-like functions, is Applesoft compatible and promises easy use of the IIGS Toolbox.

Users who prefer "real" Applesoft — and yet want more access to IIGS features — may want to investigate *Iconix* (\$39.95 retail) and *Sonix* (\$49.95 retail) from So What Software. Both programs add many new commands to Applesoft that allow access to the computer's super-high-resolution graphics and Ensoniq sound chip.

**Games.** The Apple IIGS is evolving into a premiere game computer, as this issue's feature on graphics games can attest. At AppleFest, game players flocked around booths provided by PBI Software, Inc., Activision, Accolade, Sierra On-Line and others.

Among the most popular new offerings: Spectrum Holobyte's *Tetris* and *King Of Chicago*, a gangster game from Cinemaware, Inc. where "Capone is up the river and Chicago is up for grabs." Both games offer great graphics and lots of action, which is a good omen for future IIGS game software.

See you at next year's AppleFest. ■



# The Next Generation Arrives

You know the story by now. In late 1983 AppleWorks exploded on the scene, and the result was an Apple II revolution reminiscent of the one that followed the release of VisiCalc. But this activity was much larger. AppleWorks itself prompted the sale of Apple IIs, and our little corner of the world changed.


Many Apple II magazines now carry regular AppleWorks features. "Fourth-party" publishers began marketing patches and modifications to the program. Hardware appeared that turned the AppleWorks star into a supernova. Beagle Bros., Inc. took a look at the suddenly dwindling number of programmers and the rapidly expanding base of feature-hungry AppleWorks users and it now only produces AppleWorks add-ons.

**The Question.** In 1986 the Apple IIGS was unleashed, and right away the question began to appear: Where's the IIGS version of AppleWorks? Sure, AppleWorks as it was already functioned well on the IIGS, but we all knew what was inevitable. Apple, of course, would not comment on "unannounced products." It seemed to prefer to talk about the new Mac software that kept appearing.

During the next two years, that question remained unanswered. When Claris Corp. was formed and took over ownership of most of Apple's software, some hope sprang up in the marketplace. The expectations diminished quickly when Claris announced that it would be selling new versions of all Apple's old Macintosh software titles, a whole slew of completely new Macintosh packages and, oh yes, that AppleWorks thing. . . .

**GS Works.** Then, it happened. At the Boston AppleFest in May 1988, StyleWare demonstrated an early version of an AppleWorks work-alike designed for the IIGS, using the full 16-bit power of the Apple IIGS and its Toolbox. Just in case the public might fail to immediately recognize what this was, StyleWare called it GS Works.

Claris didn't miss the point. Right away rumors began circulating that Claris might be about to buy this program from StyleWare. A couple months later the story broke that Claris had not just bought GS Works, it had bought StyleWare itself. GS Works was instantly ren-

dered legitimate with a rechristening: it would now be known as AppleWorks GS.

At the San Francisco AppleFest in September, people began to refer to the "old" program as "AppleWorks Classic." So what is this new package? What's different? Is it a worthy successor to the AppleWorks name?

First of all, realize that this is *not* a modification or even a rewrite of the existing AppleWorks — it's a completely new program that happens to share the AppleWorks name. The myriad AppleWorks enhancement packages will no more function with AppleWorks GS than they will with Choplifter.

But don't despair — you'll find that most of the features you can add on to AppleWorks are already present in AppleWorks GS. A dictionary and thesaurus are built in. Things like graphics fonts and use of all available memory are automatically there by virtue of the GS Toolbox and graphics interface. Several of the smaller accessories we've seen exist already as GS desk accessories or are already included in the AppleWorks GS program.

StyleWare paid attention to what was happening in the market. As for the features that are not yet available, you can rest assured that if there is a desire perceived for AppleWorks GS add-ons, they will appear.

**What's Inside.** AppleWorks consists of three modules: The Word Processor, the Spreadsheet and the Database Manager. AppleWorks GS includes these modules, plus it adds three more: a Telecommunications module, a Paint module and a Page Layout module.

All these modules work together, as do the AppleWorks modules. You can use the

Telecommunications module to call your favorite online service, download text into the Word Processor module, download a graphic, log off, load the graphic into the Paint module, modify or crop the graphic, merge it into the downloaded word processor document, and print the whole thing out in one shot. Whew!

The program automatically imports existing AppleWorks files (all three types), but be aware that it does not do the reverse: You cannot save your AppleWorks II GS document as a file for use in AppleWorks Classic. You can, of course, save to ASCII text files, which can in turn be loaded into the older program.

**Memory Hungry.** This program is a memory hog that requires a minimum of 1.25 MB of available system memory. The fact that it comes on three disks should serve as a warning: The program was intended to be run from a hard disk.

If you are running from a single 3.5-inch disk, you will find yourself frequently playing the disk-swap game. Two drives will make life a bit easier, but with the program trying to reference the program disk, the system disk and your data disk, you're still going to do some swapping. If you've been waiting for a reason to buy a hard disk, this may be it.

Will AppleWorks GS have the same effect on the Apple II world that the original AppleWorks did? Unlike AppleWorks was the first of its kind; nothing like it had ever been seen in the Apple II world before, and it changed the way we did things.


AppleWorks GS is not a new concept, but a logical follow-on to the original. It shares the AppleWorks name and will enjoy some advantages because of that, but it's not going to revolutionize anything.

If Claris continues to support AppleWorks GS well and if it proves to be as smoothly integrated, well crafted and functionally attractive as its predecessor, it should enjoy a long life indeed. ■

# IIGS Address

## The Waiting Game

**I purchased StyleWare's MultiScribe more than a year ago and almost immediately began to experience problems, the most annoying being that the cursor keeps disappearing. The only way I've been able to make the cursor reappear is to reboot my disk, resulting in the loss of all data that had not been saved — and, on one occasion, data that had been saved.**

**I went to the people from whom I got MultiScribe, who, having tried it on their IIGS with the same results, called StyleWare's non-800 number.**

**A StyleWare representative instructed them to tell me to return the disk along with a letter explaining the problem, which I immediately did. Several weeks later, having received no reply, I wrote to the company again. A year later, still having received no reply, I wrote a third time. That was more than a month ago, and I'm still waiting.**

StyleWare does — or, more accurately, did — have a toll-free 800 telephone number. We used it on many occasions to talk to personnel within the company's technical support department who were always cooperative.



When we called and explained your situation, a representative in the department promised to send you an updated version of the latest MultiScribe GS 3.0, which you should have received by now.

Unfortunately, your previous requests for help apparently "fell through the cracks," because the company has no record of them.

The StyleWare rep we spoke to explained that the company had fallen behind and had experienced several months of backlog before hiring additional customer service help. Even though the backlog has been resolved, your letters never surfaced.

Did you remember to put your return address and daytime phone number on the letter accompanying the disk? Putting your address on the outside envelope isn't enough; quite often the mail room disposes of the envelopes when they open the mail, and the company has no way of locating you or returning your disk.

Also, be sure to double-check a company's address before returning products or sending correspondence. A good way to do this is to verify addresses in the "Apple IIGS Hardware And Software Directory" of *The Apple IIGS Buyer's Guide* or in current advertisements. Most companies are very good about notifying magazines and advertising agencies when they move.

When problems arise, the best thing to do is call the company in question's customer service department. Many companies have

toll-free 800 numbers. But even if you have to pay for a call, your phone is usually the quickest way to solve a problem, such as your missing disk.

We speak of StyleWare and its toll-free phone number in the past tense because the company has been purchased by Claris, the distributors of AppleWorks. All of StyleWare's programs, and its programming and technical staff, have joined the Claris organization in California.

Claris now provides technical support for all of StyleWare's former products, including MultiScribe GS, Top Draw and the rest. GS Works, StyleWare's integrated IIGS program, has been renamed AppleWorks GS and should now be available. We'll review the product in our next issue.

Any calls or mail directed to StyleWare's former address in Houston will be forwarded to Claris. You can save some time, however, by contacting Claris directly.

## Compatibility Questioned

**I purchased one of the first Apple IIGS computers in November 1986 and have generally been satisfied with its performance. The computer was oversold though, because of its original promise of running all of the software in the Apple II series.**

**For example, I purchased the Dollars and Sense financial accounting software title by Monogram, which the dealer said would run on my IIGS. Alas, it doesn't.**

**I called Monogram, and a source at the company explained that the program was never intended for use on any other computer than the Apple II.**

**Because I purchased the software quite awhile ago, recourse through the retailer is not realistic. I've learned another lesson in the jungle of software promises: "caveat emptor."**

**If the packaging doesn't indicate it one way or another, how can you tell if software for the Apple II series will run on the IIGS?**

**Also, I urge your readers to be very careful in buying older software and to get promises in writing.**

We're sorry you were misled, but Apple Computer, Inc. never claimed that the IIGS would be 100 percent compatible with earlier Apples. Your dealer and others may have misled you in this regard.

By definition, there is no way any computer can be 100 percent Apple IIe compatible without actually being an Apple IIe. Even minor modifications, such as improving the processor, character set or internal programs (the three improvements in the enhanced IIe), caused minor incompatibility problems when they were first introduced.

Theoretically, it's possible for a program to fail if you put in a new interface card — even a card that has nothing to do with your program.

Because the Apple IIGS includes many improvements over the Apple IIe, it isn't surprising that there are several small incompatibilities. For example, some programs won't work with the older Apple II UniDisk drive, which was originally designed for the Apple IIe. The programs that don't work "expect" to find the newer Apple 3.5 Drive.

Even a simple enhancement to the IIGS, including the new system ROM upgrade, can cause problems. A handful of early IIGS programs refuse to work with the new system ROM. Fortunately, free or low-cost (e.g., postage and handling costs) updates are available for most of these programs.

Apple typically states that the IIGS is about 95 percent software compatible with programs written for the IIe and IIC. Considering the computer industry at large, we find this fact impressive.

To make life easier for users and dealers alike, Apple has distributed an Apple IIGS compatibility guide to its dealers that shows which major programs are and are not compatible.

So what precautions can you take to avoid compatibility problems in the future? Your best bet is to check out a program on your own computer and determine for yourself what special hardware/software requirements are needed.

We realize that taking your computer with you when you want to purchase software is not practical. However, you may want to ask your dealer if you can return a program that doesn't work with your hardware.

Most dealers are somewhat reluctant to allow returns, because unscrupulous buyers purchase programs, make illegal copies and return the originals, claiming the software is defective or incompatible. Consequently, many dealers have no software return policies or will replace defective software only with identical replacements.

Still, any dealer who is willing to understand your point of view — and willing to make sure that the program(s) you're interested in will work on your system — is valuable to you.

The next best thing is to check out the program you want to purchase on a dealer's demo computer. This process has limitations, too.

The dealer's hardware may have a newer version of the system software or hardware, or a different set of peripherals, than on your machine. Of course, if a package states on the box that it's IIGS compatible or incompatible, that makes your job even easier.

Incompatibility with hardware is a serious issue; something few software developers take lightly. While some vendors may ignore an unusual hardware configuration, no publisher can ignore an incompatibility with every Apple IIGS user for long.

After all, Apple is now selling more IIGS computers than all the other Apple II models combined.

## Software Books

**I recently purchased an Apple IIGS. Being a professional programmer, I am interested in writing my own programs. I've seen versions of Basic, Pascal and Assembler languages for the IIGS, and you've mentioned a version of C in earlier issues. Do you know where I can get those languages?**

**Also, I've seen tons of books from Apple and other publishers on programming the IIGS. I would probably have to sell my system to buy all of these books and spend the next five years reading them. I would appreciate any recommendations you could make as to what to read first.**

We've reviewed quite a few of those languages in past issues of *The Apple IIGS Buyer's Guide*. There are at least four versions of Basic available (AC/Basic, ZBasic, Apple IIGS Basic and Micol Basic) and four versions of Pascal (Apple UCSD Pascal 1.3, Instant Pascal, TML Pascal and ORCA/M Pascal — all reviewed in the Winter 1987 issue).

APW (Apple Programmer's Workshop) and a version of the C compiler are available from the Apple Programmers and Developers Association (APDA). These versions were reviewed in the Summer '88 issue.

All of these products are listed in our "Apple IIGS Hardware And Software Directory," along with their system requirements and retail prices.

You're correct about the books. There are literally hundreds available from a variety of companies. Many of these books are also listed in the product directory in the back of this magazine.

A good set of books produced by Apple is sold through Addison-Wesley's computer-book division. You may want to investigate the following titles: *Programmer's Introduction To The Apple IIGS* (to start learning how to program); the *Apple IIGS Toolbox Reference, Volumes 1 and 2* (to use the Toolbox); the *Apple IIGS ProDOS 16 Reference* and *ProDOS 8 Technical Reference Manual* (to work with files); the *Apple IIGS Programmer's Workshop C Reference* (to use C); and the *Apple IIGS Programmer's Workshop Assembler Reference* and *Apple Programmer's Workshop Assembler Toolbox Quick Reference* (to use Assembly language).

Other general books in the series — for example, those dealing with the ImageWriter or LaserWriter — can also be useful. The books range from introductory guides to very technical programming manuals.

## Consistent Ratings

**I like your new ratings thermometer where you rate products based on several parameters, but I question how the ratings are decided. It appears that each review uses a different set of standards. While one review might have gotten a very high mark, another much better product could have gotten a lower mark.**

**A ratings system is good, but only if it's consistent.**

Each product reviewer now has a scale to use that shows how products should relate to one another. Notice that another parameter — Innovation — has been added, which answers the following questions: How far does a product advance the field? Is the product a rehash of an old idea or does it provide something new?

Each reviewer still has personal feelings and opinions, but the rating scale should add more consistency to the ratings system.

## Hidden Accessories

**As a programmer, I was happy to upgrade my IIGS' system ROM when I heard that the new ROM had extra desk accessories just for programmers. When I access the desk accessories, however, all I see is the Control Panel and Alternate Display mode — the same two desk accessories as before.**

How can I access the new desk accessories?

First, and most importantly, these accessories are only in the new IIGS system ROM, not the original ROM. (You can tell the new ROM, because it says "System ROM version 01" on the bottom of the screen when you turn on your computer).

Enter Applesoft Basic by booting the Pro-DOS 8 system disk or any other program that lets you enter Applesoft. Enter the Apple monitor (the machine language user-input program) by typing "CALL-151" and hitting Return. This tells Applesoft Basic to run the machine language program that starts at address —151 (\$FF59 hex), which is the monitor. The screen prompt will change from Applesoft's "]" to the machine language's "##" prompt.

At this point type "#" and hit Return. This tells the system ROM to install the extra routines. The two routines are labeled "Visit Monitor" and "Memory Peeker." They're accessed through the same Control-Esc-Open Apple command as the Control Panel.

The Visit Monitor command lets you enter the machine language monitor program (the same program from which you set up the new desk accessories). Big deal you say — you can enter the monitor from Basic. True, but the desk accessory Visit Monitor routine

lets you go into the monitor from within another program. It's especially useful if you want to save a high-resolution or super-high-resolution screen.

Try using the Visit Monitor command and boot another program disk to save the screen. The Memory Peeker utility lets you examine which banks of memory are in use, available or purged from the IIGS' Memory Manager. It's especially useful for a development programmer who is using a large memory board.

Both routines are extremely valuable to programmers. But because most people would be confused by their use, the routines are designed to remain dormant until you activate them with the "#" command.

## Protection Explained

**What's the difference between "copy protect" and "write protect"?**

A write protected disk is a disk that the disk drive mechanism "knows" not to write on. Such a diskette can only be read from. The situation is similar to popping out a protect tab on an audio cassette. If you have extremely important data, or a new program disk, you should always write protect it before copying it or using it.

On 3.5-inch disks, the write protect feature is activated by a small moving shutter. When the shutter is open, the disk is write protected. When the shutter is closed, the disk can be written to.

On 5.25-inch diskettes, the write protect mechanism is a notch in the disk. When the notch is covered with a piece of opaque tape, it's protected.

The write protect mechanism only protects the disk head's write circuitry from writing to the diskette. A malfunctioning disk mechanism can destroy data, whether or not diskettes are write protected.

Even write protected diskettes can be erased by magnetic fields, fed to the dog by accident or lost. Write protecting a disk doesn't mean you shouldn't also make a backup copy.

A copy protected disk is a commercial diskette where the manufacturer has put in a software modification to prevent you from making extra copies of that disk. Some copy

protected disks refuse to copy at all; others may appear to copy, but the copies won't work. In other cases, a program will ask you to insert your original disk before it will proceed.

Copy protection exists because many people make illegal copies of programs for their friends — or for sale — causing software manufacturers to lose sales to the illegal copies.

What happens when something goes wrong with a copy protected diskette? Depending on the company, you can usually get a replacement copy by mail. Because of the inconvenience involved, though, many companies have decided to stop copy protecting their products.

We'll continue to cover this ongoing issue in this magazine.

## Mac And IIGS Drives

**A friend of mine sold me an 800K disk drive that, even though it works fine on his Macintosh, won't work properly on my IIGS. What does it take to attach it properly?**

**I know that the Apple 3.5 Drive, which I got with my IIGS, works fine on his Macintosh, but I'd really like to use his drive as a second drive with my IIGS.**

Early Macintosh external disk drives will work only with a Macintosh computer. The Apple 3.5 Drive, which Apple now sells as an external drive for a Macintosh, is the same external drive (either first drive or second drive) for the Apple IIGS.

You would think that the early Macintosh drives would be compatible with the newer ones, but this isn't the case.

The IIGS disk interface only works with the Apple UniDisk 3.5 (an older 3.5-inch drive originally designed for the Apple IIe and IIc, but it also works fine on the IIGS) or the Apple 3.5 Drive (the platinum drive that is now sold by Apple as the Macintosh external drive, as well as the IIGS drive).

The only solution to your problem would be to find a Macintosh user who has an Apple 3.5 Drive and to swap your Macintosh drive with that user. The Macintosh external drive will work fine with the Macintosh (naturally), and you'll have the Apple 3.5 Drive as the second drive on your IIGS. ■




# Lights...Camera...IIGS!

## How To Make And Enhance Home Videos On Your Apple IIGS And VCR

---

*Don't look for results from this dynamic duo on MTV. Do prepare for a lot of creative fun as you and your two favorite appliances join forces for an all-out attack on ordinary home movies.*

---

**O**ne of the big selling points of the Apple IIGS has always been its sparkling color graphics — bold, sharp and static. Even those fabulous IIGS paintings and pictures, splashed across ads and computer articles, just sit there in their splendor, frozen on the screen or page. But, with the help of some creative software, you can make pictures move — and even record them on videotape to complement family videos.

The four packages reviewed here permit you to make movies on your IIGS, including animations and video titles that can challenge the creativity of the whole family. The results won't threaten Disney, but they can both enlighten and entertain, and anybody with a graphic bent would do well to give them a whirl.

Two of the packages are brand new and form an entirely new software genre, computerized video effects. We'll review them first.

### The VCR As Computer Peripheral

VCR Companion by Broderbund Software, Inc., and Home Video Producer by Epyx, Inc., are a new type of Apple software: programs that permit users to create titles and other graphics on their computers and then record them directly from the computer onto videotape.

With these two packages, you can add credits, titles, endings and identifying text to existing home videos. By inserting appropriate on-screen labels, you can identify whole tapes or snippets of unrelated scenes, which have been combined — sometimes over months or years — on a single videocassette. Better yet, you can set out to create videos that are intended from the start to combine real-life pictures and sound with the colorful illustrations and text, cartoons and animation that the programs can create.

### The Right Connections

Apple IIGS owners anxious to try out the concept may first be stumped by the question of just how one links a IIGS to a VCR. It sounds complicated and costly. However, it is neither. With just a single cable — one of the least expensive and most commonly available types of cable — most VCRs can be hooked to a IIGS and made, in effect, into computer peripherals.

Here's an example of how easy it is.

We assume you have a fairly standard VCR, already attached to a TV, and a fairly standard IIGS — one that uses the standard Apple IIGS RGB monitor. Remote control for the VCR isn't necessary, but is helpful if the VCR isn't within reach. (Details of the hookup will vary a bit with unusual VCRs, or those that aren't hooked to a TV, or with other Apple II models or IIGSs that use composite monitors instead of the standard RGB.)

We also assume that the two machines are, or can be made to be, reasonably close together — say, in the same room — or in adjoining rooms where the angles are such that you can work the VCRs remote and see the TV to which the VCR is attached, while sitting at the IIGS.

Once this routine equipment is properly situated, all you need to do is obtain a cable called an "RCA" cable — one that has a male RCA plug on both ends. This is the type of cable you'd use to attach a composite or monochrome monitor to your IIGS, if you weren't already using the much superior RGB monitor.

Because this cable is also used to link many other video, audio and computer components, it is widely available in video, stereo and electronics stores in many lengths and is relatively inexpensive. Be sure to get a cable long enough to comfortably cover the distance between the IIGS and the VCR, though extreme lengths may result in a weakened signal.

With many standard setups, you won't have to disconnect anything on the IIGS or VCR, because the jacks into which you will be plugging the cable aren't normally used.

On the IIGS, face the back and locate the round jack toward the right with the little picture of an empty TV screen underneath (it's right under the power cord and between the wide RGB monitor jack and the socket for the keyboard). That's the composite video port. Plug one end of the cable into it.

Now look over the VCR and find the jack labeled "video in." It is sometimes used to attach cameras or other VCRs during dubbing. On some older models, it may be located on the front instead of the rear. Plug the remaining end of the RCA cable into this video-in jack.

With the cable connected, you are ready to record the images prepared on the IIGS onto videotape. On some VCRs, in some modes, you may also be able to see on the TV the same thing that appears while you work on your IIGS screen. Certain VCRs require you to flip a switch to Camera or Line or L mode to see on the TV the signal coming from the video-in port, rather than what's coming in from a regular broadcast signal.

## Fire Up The Software

Home Video Producer and VCR Companion are distinct packages with different capabilities and features. But both work generally the same.

First, you use the software and your IIGS monitor to create a computerized "film," which can have one or many frames or scenes in it — words and graphics, still or moving. Then, using manual or remote control, you turn your VCR onto Record and immediately press Pause on the VCR or remote to suspend the recording process before it can really get going. You then command the software to play back your computerized sequence for video recording, press Pause again on the VCR or remote, and the VCR will record onto videotape the images the computer is playing back. When the computer film has played, turn the VCR to Pause again, or to Stop, and you're done.

Several cautions apply to both programs.

First, any computer-created sequence you record onto an existing tape *will override and wipe out* any scenes already existing on that portion of the tape. On some meandering home videos, this won't matter much. The first minute of the tape may be expendable anyway — out-of-focus, over-zoomed or just no different than what comes later. But be careful.

Second, neither program has audio. You can add music or commentary to your computer titles later, if your VCR permits you to dub sound onto a tape with a stereo linkup or microphone. But the software discussed here won't do it for you.

Third, these programs aren't IIGS-specific and don't use the super-high-resolution graphics of the IIGS. That means that, even on the IIGS monitor, the graphics and text you create for recording won't be as sharp and bold as the best IIGS images. And your VCR and TV have lower resolution than the IIGS RGB monitor, so the images will look worse when played back than they do on your monitor.

It will take some experimenting to find colors, fonts and pictures that won't blur or look faded on the TV, but it can be done (especially if you can view the results through the TV while you work). It will take practice to properly synchronize the VCR and computer so the taped segment starts and ends smoothly.

The results are acceptable for home videos, and both programs do a decent job. But don't expect professional-quality video.

## Home Video Producer

Epyx's entry in the new video software field, Home Video Producer, employs a photographic film metaphor. Using on-screen icons that look like individual frames of movie film, you enter text and graphics to produce "frames." These frames can then be combined into a film "strip," and multiple strips can be linked to form a computer-generated "movie." Frames, strips and movies can all be previewed on the IIGS monitor, cut and pasted, and — in the case of strips and movies — saved to and retrieved from disk.

For instance, your first frame might just be a backdrop — a background color and border pattern. In the next frame, you might introduce some text (Steven's Birthday Party), gradually revealing itself at the top. The third frame might feature a picture of a birthday present materializing beneath the text. In the fourth, another text line might slide into sight at the bottom (September 5, 1988). The whole thing could then be combined into a strip, saved to a data disk and recorded by your VCR onto the start of a tape containing birthday footage.

Home Video Producer is generally well designed, using on-screen icons and pull-down menus. Unfortunately, however, it treats the IIGS as if it didn't exist, making the whole thing operate as clumsily as on an Apple II+. The mouse isn't supported at all (isn't this 1988?), and using the joystick to select from menus and small icons is so cumbersome that only keyboard control is practical. The package comes with two 5.25-inch disks and no 3.5-inch disk, necessitating much disk swapping. Fortunately, however, it isn't copy protected and thus can be speeded up a bit by copying it onto a 3.5-inch disk or hard disk.

The manual is slim (46 small pages) and just barely adequate. It covers IBM and Commodore installation, as well as Apple, and doesn't picture any of the fonts, graphics, borders or strip templates included. As previously noted, Home Video Producer uses pre-IIGS graphics. An addendum to the manual says it runs on the IIGS in IIe mode. At some stages in its execution, Home Video Producer



A spectrum of colors and drawing tools in VCR Companion add illustrative effects to the edit sequence.


is also terribly slow. Loading data can seem to take forever, particularly when it's gearing up to play an entire strip.

Much of the work is done at the individual frame level. These frames can contain text or graphics, based on fonts and images supplied with the program. No provision for importing fonts or graphics is mentioned in the manual. After choosing the contents of a frame, the user then must select from a number of "effects" — how the frame will come up on the screen, how quickly it will appear and how long it will linger before the next frame plays. You can make images gradually materialize from top to bottom or side to side and use other fancy effects.

A nice feature of Home Video Producer is that it provides great control over the sizing and positioning of a frame on the screen. This allows great creativity in having text and graphics overlap in space and time. Unfortunately, real animation — having each separate object move — isn't possible, except in a complex and jerky manner.

The program comes with Template strips, which can be personalized and edited.

As noted above, this program (and its competition) can produce fuzzy and ineffective images on a TV screen unless great care is taken in picking color, graphic and font combinations, which stand out cleanly. Be prepared for considerable trial and error, made easier by Home Video Producer's good previewing ability. And remember: What counts is how a frame looks on TV when played through your VCR, not how it looks on your high-priced IIGS RGB monitor.



Users get a clear picture of what the combined frames will present.

Home Video Producer really shines when it comes to managing the process by which a user actually records a strip or movie onto videotape. The principal problem in doing this is that controlling the VCR with its Pause button can be so imprecise that your tape breaks up at the start or end of the segment, records unwanted material from the computer, or cuts off part of the desired material. Epyx has designed a very clever audio signaling system that provides a user with five warning beeps of different tones to give the time necessary to execute the pauses and capture what's coming from the computer smoothly.

### VCR Companion

Broderbund, long a mainstay in Apple II graphics, has produced another winner in VCR Companion.

The program is packed with powerful features, including good animation. It uses the familiar Print Shop menu-and-icon technique, supports the mouse and comes with a clear, well-written 55-page manual. There's a quick-reference card that includes color samples of the program's built-in fonts, borders, backgrounds, icons and animations. VCR Companion also allows the use of graphics from three other Broderbund programs: Dazzle Draw, Fantavision for the IIe and Animate.

In addition to producing images to be recorded on videotape, VCR Companion can produce self-booting "filmdisks" that will play your computer movies on a computer monitor.

Despite these strengths, VCR Companion shares some drawbacks with Home Video Producer. It also comes only on two 5.25-inch disks and doesn't recognize the IIGS, though you can send for a 3.5-inch disk for \$10, and there's a utility provided for installation on a hard disk. If you rely on just the standard diskettes and have only a single 5.25-inch drive (as many IIGS owners do), you'll do lots of disk swapping.


In addition, VCR Companion, unlike Home Video Producer, is copy protected, and it costs \$10 for a backup.

Perhaps the worst flaw in VCR Companion, however, is that it doesn't provide a smooth interface for recording the images it creates on video. Unlike Home Video Producer, it doesn't give a user audio prompts that help coordinate the computer output and the workings of the pause control (though it does play separate audio prompts to signal the need to swap disks).

There aren't any movie-frame icons in VCR Companion. Instead, the user constructs a vertical, scrolling "script" of each step in the computerized video. Each line in the script is an "element" that could be a background picture, border, text, animation, special effect and so forth. Each element line starts with a small icon indicating what types of effects it represents and the name of the particular image. All or part of a script may be previewed.

A typical VCR Companion script might display a picture of a beach with a palm tree, over which the words Our Vacation 1988 might appear, twinkling. Next, a jet might fly

across the scene from side to side. The package includes ready-made scripts that can be edited and customized.

Special effects are varied. Images can appear on screen in numerous ways, and you can create more of these transitions with a special editor. Text or images can be made to glitter, or twinkle, and more. Scripts can be saved to and retrieved from disk and linked together.

VCR Companion permits a user to do more complicated and varied things on video than does Home Video Producer. But it can take a lot more work to avoid breakup, garbage or truncated images with VCR Companion than with Home Video Producer.

IIGS owners interested in creating mini-movies without a VCR aren't out of luck. Here's a quick look at two older programs from Broderbund that do a very nice job of creating animated computer art.

### Fantavision GS

This is the only program of the four covered here that is optimized for the IIGS and uses IIGS graphics. Introduced in 1987, this copy protected program mostly works with stick figures and geometric shapes, but it permits a wide variety of colorful effects — including sounds — to be built into movies. And the supplied 3.5-inch disk cuts way down on disk swapping.

The program includes a rich supply of drawing animation tools and relies on two innovative techniques — tweening, in which the intermediate steps in a sequence are automatically supplied by the computer; and transformation, in which a switch from one form to another is smoothed out to look natural.

The manual is excellent, and a quick-reference card is provided. A matinee demo of various professionally done Fantavision movies is mesmerizing in and of itself, and provides inspiration for a user's own work.

### Animate

This copy protected program, which debuted in 1986, has nothing special for the IIGS, but still provides a way to make pleasing animations using more lifelike figures and scenery than Fantavision.

Animate includes two program modules. In the Graphic Designer, drawing tools are provided to permit the creation, frame-by-frame, of the characters to be animated.

In the Scene Designer, the characters are placed on backgrounds to create movies, and sound can be added using a built-in simple computer piano program.

As with most Broderbund programs, the manual is unsparing and well done. It even includes a special booklet on the art of animation. The main drawback to Animate is that it uses the old Dazzle Draw menu-bar interface, in which the text can be tough to read on a IIGS screen. But the actual art stands out clearly.

### Finally, A Lament

I find it personally disappointing that neither of the two new video-animation programs reviewed here is a IIGS-specific package. Instead, both take the path of least resistance, adopting the lowest common denominator: compatibility with all Apple II models. In doing so, they have passed up the chance to use the features that make the IIGS special, namely, superior graphics and sound.

Both are good programs, as noted above. It may be that super-high-resolution graphics are superfluous for them, because TV sets can't display graphics that well. And it should be noted that their publishers, Broderbund and Epyx, have both published other wonderful IIGS-only software.

Still, graphics programs like these ought to be available in IIGS versions, packaged with 3.5-inch disks, now that the IIGS is a mature machine with a large installed base. What's more, it really helps when these programs recognize the mouse as the principal menu-selection and drawing tool. It's truly mystifying that Epyx could fail to support the mouse in a program published in 1988.

IIGS owners who buy VCR Companion and Home Video Producer will find they work well. But how much better it would be if they were real IIGS programs! ■





# Apple Gets Personal: A Sneak Preview Of AppleLink Personal Edition

*What should you think about AppleLink?*

*Read this first report from the field before you form any opinions.*

Sooner or later, almost everyone with a computer and a modem is tempted to subscribe to one of the big national online information services. Compuserve (the largest, with a 35 percent share of the market), The Source, Genie and several other contenders compete intensely for your telecommunications dollars.

Because less than one-third of home computer users have modems, there appears to be little room for another contender, especially one dedicated to a single brand name. Apple, which thinks there is a home-market opportunity, is making a substantial investment to prove its thinking is correct.

## Background

AppleLink Personal Edition was officially announced on May 20, 1988 at AppleFest in Boston. The service is a joint venture of Apple Computer and Quantum Computer Services of Vienna, Virginia. Quantum pioneered the idea with Q-Link, a successful online service for the Commodore 64/128 community.

The original AppleLink is Apple's private network and bulletin board for dealers and developers. At this writing, there were no plans to connect that AppleLink service to the user-oriented Personal Edition.

Months of beta testing with a large and diverse population of users have worked the bugs out of the AppleLink software, which should now be available at authorized Apple dealers. A Macintosh version is expected to be ready in late 1988.

MouseText is the secret of AppleLink. Most means of telecommunications are limited to the regular ASCII character set, which makes for plain, text-only screen displays and command-line or menu-based user interfaces. The standard ASCII character set allows most services to operate equally well with almost any sort of computer or dumb terminal.

MouseText is an extended character set that lets the Apple II family emulate the pull-down menus, scrolling windows, dialog boxes, radio buttons, check boxes and other paraphernalia of the Apple Desktop (i.e., Macintosh) user interface. MouseTalk (published by United Software Industries), a pop-

ular communications program for the Apple II family, uses MouseText to create an unusually friendly, flexible terminal environment.

AppleLink carries the idea a step further by supporting the MouseText environment from a host computer, as well as the user's end of a linkup. AppleLink doesn't just send a stream of characters; it sends commands to your computer. The software uses the commands to construct windows, pull-down menus and other desktop features.

Special icons, which demand high-resolution graphics and can be displayed on command, are stored as complete screens on the AppleLink user's disk. The IIgs version of the AppleLink software uses super-high-resolution (320 mode) color graphics to depict the icons. Otherwise, the software is essentially identical to the Apple IIe/IIc version, which uses simpler green and white high-resolution graphics.

AppleLink is hosted on a Stratus 2000XE mainframe system that includes many megabytes of RAM and gigabytes of hard disk storage. Even with thousands of subscribers, the system will be difficult to overload.



## Evaluation Of AppleLink

### Performance: 8.0 (very good)

The IIgs version of the AppleLink software suffers from the usual ProDOS 16 performance penalties. Fortunately, you can always run the ProDOS 8 version when you aren't showing the system off to friends. The only difference is graphics resolution. Except for this minor point, AppleLink's performance depends on the speed of your modem and the quality of your local phone lines.

### Innovation: 9.0 (excellent)

AppleLink for the Apple II series represents a real breakthrough in 8-bit personal computer telecommunications. It takes text-based systems about as far as they can go. The next step — multimedia telecommunications, exploiting the sound and graphics potential of the IIgs — would require much higher baud rates.

### Documentation/Support: 8.0 (very good)

This is a provisional rating, based on the beta test experience. The final package is likely to be more polished. Customer Service, both at Apple in Cupertino and at Quantum in Virginia, has been very accessible, prompt and responsive.

The AppleLink Guides found in certain areas are the ultimate online help system — real people who can communicate with you.

### Ease Of Use: 9.0 (excellent)

Point and click, what could be simpler? The icons and menus make AppleLink easy to learn and simple to navigate, compared to the complex command-driven interface typical of other online services.

### Value: 8.0 (underpriced)

AppleLink is a virtual necessity for people deeply involved in Apple computing. For more casual users, its value will depend on their specific needs and how much time they can afford to spend online. For some users, the value of "free" downloaded software will more than justify the subscription cost.

## What It Takes

The Apple II version of AppleLink Personal Edition requires a IIgs, IIc or enhanced IIe, plus a modem and the AppleLink software. Some color graphics screens exist, but a monochrome monitor is perfectly adequate for the MouseText environment.

The AppleLink program recognizes when an ImageWriter printer is connected to a IIgs' printer port, but only for offline printing. Some other telecommunications programs allow you to send text to a printer while you are still online. This is a convenient feature that should be added to AppleLink as soon as possible.

You boot the AppleLink disk like any other ProDOS application. The program automatically checks for the presence of a modem and configures it correctly. The opening screen gives you four choices, which are represented as large icons. The choices are: Sign-On, Set Up, Work Offline and Options.

Set Up is a simple matter of choosing a local access number from a booklet and specifying some of the characteristics of your equipment. Work Offline includes a complete set of ProDOS 8 file management utilities. With this selection, you can format a blank disk, compose a memo or print out files you have previously downloaded. When you click the Sign-On icon, the program displays the progress of your call:

- Dialing...
- Connecting...
- Checking Password...
- and Verifying Disk.

Your password is permanently encoded on the disk, so you never have to enter it again manually. If the disk is damaged or accidentally erased, you have to get a new password. The IIgs version of the AppleLink software comes on a 3.5-inch disk, but the 8-bit version (on 5.25-inch media) works perfectly well on a IIgs — in fact, it loads and starts up faster.

You can record two different Tymnet, Telenet or DataPac access numbers. If one number happens to be busy or down, the program will automatically try another number. In most U.S. and Canadian urban areas, AppleLink is a local call.

A welcoming screen tells you about current activities and features. If you have mail waiting for you, a small flag on a mailbox icon pops up on screen and the program beeps. You then have a choice: click on the Apple logo to go uptown to the Apple Community or click on the globe icon to go downtown to General Services.

It's easy to be overwhelmed by the abundance of available options. Our cautious strategy was to become familiar with a few areas first, then gradually branch out and explore new terrain. After four months of intensive online exploration, there are still "places" we haven't visited, but we are trying to make the rounds.

After checking our mail at the Post Office, we usually stop by the Apple Hardware Forum to read the latest IIgs rumors and gossip, drop into the Software Center to see if there are any new downloads and then head over to The Mall to see if any buyers have responded to our Classified ads. (We've sold enough surplus hardware and books to almost pay our phone bill this month.)

If time permits, we read the latest wire service reports from the Mideast in the Newsroom and check a few stock prices in the Financial District. Finally, we drop by the People Connection to chat for a few minutes with friends across the country whom we've never met.


You sign off by pulling down the File menu and selecting Sign-Off. Reluctant to see you leave so soon, the program asks you to confirm your choice, bids you farewell and offers a report of how long you were connected. With a bit of advance planning, you can keep your total elapsed time down to an affordable 20 minutes or less. If you're curious, you can even drop by Customer Service to check your current billing total.

You have to reboot your computer to run another program — a nice future enhancement would be the option of quitting to a program selector.

Standard keyboard shortcuts are available for mouse haters. Every dialog box is marked with an Open-Apple command that does the same thing as clicking in the box. There is also a Keyword system for quick program navigation. For example, you can go directly to the AppleWorks special interest forum by pressing Open-Apple-K and then typing AAW.

The software is pleasantly intuitive; it works the way you expect it to work. Even in beta testing, it was remarkably bug free, considering it's so complex.

Hardware and software setup is meticulously documented in the included *User Manual*. We still managed to make several dumb mistakes, however, such as forgetting to set the modem port to "Your Card" on the IIgs Control Panel, but the Customer Service people at the other end of a toll-free 800 number were unfailingly patient, polite and competent.



Apple enthusiasts can hone their technical skills and knowledge with a quick survey through various information avenues in AppleLink Personal Edition.

Apple IIGS owners who use external modems must plug their modems into the computer's built-in serial port, rather than a serial card in a slot. If you're using an internal modem, you have to tell the software that you're using a Super Serial Card.

We had good results with both setups at 1,200 and 2,400 baud, despite the noisy phone lines of Southern California.

### The Post Office

The Post Office menu is directly accessible from any part of AppleLink. If you have incoming mail waiting, the word MAIL appears prominently in the bottom right corner of your screen. When you open your mail, the display lists all new messages, the senders and appropriate dates. When you click on an item, it appears in a scrollable window, including sufficient space below to send a direct reply.

Users are addressed by their Screen Names, and each handle can be up to 10 characters in length. Some users pick colorful screen names (Mouskowitz, AFL MadMac, Herr Fixit); others accept the assigned defaults (SteveL39, WendyR16 and so on). Users may even elect to have their real names and addresses listed in an online Member Directory.

You can easily save a message to disk or send an entire file by simply typing a pathname into a field of the display. You can even

recall old messages, although the system will delete them after a certain time limit.

You can also send Flash Notes to a user who is currently logged on. This activity requires a bit of discretion and courtesy, because an incoming Flash Note interrupts whatever the addressee is doing.

By selecting Find Someone and entering a screen name, you can find out where a user is and if the user is currently logged on.

Free software is one of the great attractions of any online service, and AppleLink is no exception. AppleLink makes the downloading (and uploading) of software relatively painless. You type in a pathname and the system finds the correct drive.

For long files, AppleLink displays a "gauge" that measures the percentage of the file remaining to be transferred. Most program files are sent in a packed, or compressed, format. The program disk includes a file conversion utility to pack or unpack files. The initial "Top Ten Downloads" on AppleLink include the following:

- **Sub Attack** — a IIGS arcade game
- **Talk Is Cheap** — a classic shareware communications program
- **SHR Convert** — a graphics format converter
- **ECP 8bit** — a ProDOS program selector
- **FreeWriter** — a simple word processor

Many of the special interest forums are slated to have their own software libraries available for downloading. At this writing, many of the libraries were still empty. The AppleLink staff will need to put a lot of effort into ensuring a fresh and varied supply of public-domain software.

## Reference Library

The Reference Library in the Apple Community includes extensive files of Apple product and technical information, such as the table of contents from every Apple user's manual. There are also listings of special education solutions, a User Group directory, the catalog of the Apple Programmers and Developers Association, and the vast Menu online software catalog.

The Learning Center in General Services gives you access to an online version of the *Grolier Encyclopedia*. We used this resource several times to look up obscure historical and mythological facts. We were amazed by how quick and easy it was to conduct a search and to save the resulting text file to disk.

## The Big Events

AppleLink includes a number of Auditorium events with unlimited capacity. Every month at least one major figure from the world of Apple appears as a guest "speaker" (usually at 10 p.m. Eastern Standard Time). Featured speakers have included Steve Wozniak, Del Yocam (president, Apple Education and Apple Pacific) and Jean-Louis Gassee (president, Apple Products).

A rather strict protocol governs these events, because there would be chaos if 50 people tried to communicate at once. You "raise your hand" to ask a question by sending a single question mark character. Your input is disabled until the moderator calls on you or invites you onto the "stage." If you miss a session, you can download a transcript from the Auditorium archives.

You subscribe to AppleLink Personal Edition by purchasing a kit from your local authorized Apple dealer. The suggested retail price of \$35 includes the software, *User Guide*, a year's subscription and two hours of non-prime connect time.

Non-prime time, at \$6 per hour, runs from 6 p.m. to 7 a.m. local time on weekdays and all day on weekends. At all other times the rate is a hefty \$15 per hour. Rates are the

same for 300-, 1,200- or 2,400-baud service. You can arrange to have your costs deducted painlessly from your checking account or billed to a major credit card.

Your subscription includes a stylish monthly magazine, *AppleLink Update*, which includes a schedule of events and activities, informative feature articles and pontifical pronouncements by industry leaders. The August issue ran 48 colorful pages of useful info.

## The Future

AppleLink Personal Edition is an essential life-support system for anyone who is deeply involved in the world of Apple computing. This fanatical fringe includes programmers, product developers, free-lance journalists and user group activists. For many special interests, one or two of the many services on AppleLink are worth the cost of membership.

For the average Apple user, the potential benefits of AppleLink need to be weighed against the cost. Unlike many other services, AppleLink is limited to a single brand name; you may find wider horizons on CompuServe, Genie or The Source, once you master their more difficult user interfaces.

For many months to come, AppleLink users are likely to remain a relatively small group, drawn mainly from among educators, long-time user group members and the software developer community.

So far, AppleLink has shown admirable tolerance and freedom of electronic speech. We have seen no attempts by the management to enforce Apple's party line or stifle dissent. Response to user feedback has been quick and courteous.

As the membership increases, the value of AppleLink will grow. Right now, for example, you can only exchange mail with a fairly limited circle of people on AppleLink, but you can reach thousands of people on CompuServe, The Source or Genie. As Macintosh users become an increasing part of the AppleLink community, the style and outlook of the service may change, but it will certainly acquire many new resources. ■



# Graphic Mind Games


Today's IIGS games serve every need, from sophisticated mind games to shoot-em-ups. How well do they exploit the computer's capabilities?

When the Apple IIGS was introduced in late 1986, it was hailed as a machine with tremendous potential for graphics-based games. Two years later however, we wonder if it has lived up to that promise. In this article, we'll look at a representative sample of IIGS games to see how they handle the IIGS' graphics capabilities.

The Apple IIGS is capable of several different graphics modes, including all the modes available on previous Apple IIs and two new ones. The new modes, both called "super high resolution," are the only IIGS-specific modes. Because super high resolution is where the power lies, that's what we'll look at in this article.

Super-high-resolution graphics in the 320 mode allow a resolution of 320 pixels horizontally by 200 pixels vertically. In this mode, 16 colors can be displayed on each of 200 lines from any of up to 16 palettes. This allows up to 256 colors on screen at a time, even though most applications seem to limit you to only 16 colors on screen at a time.

## GRAPHICS

### What's The Limit?

Jason Harper, author of the popular graphics conversion program SHRCConvert, has shown that it is possible to display up to 3,200 colors at once on an Apple IIGS screen. To do so requires careful planning and timing, however. As yet, no commercial applications have tried to cross the 256-color barrier. Indeed, as mentioned, only a few can display more than 16 colors on the screen at a time.

Super-high-resolution graphics in the 640 mode allow 640 pixels horizontally by 200 vertically, but now the palettes — and therefore the lines — only contain four colors each. A dithering technique makes it possible to display more colors, but this method is not in widespread use as yet.

The 640-mode graphics provide the sharpest resolution, while the 320 mode is the most flexible with colors. It is possible to display a mixed-mode picture, with some scan lines in 320 mode and others in 640 mode, but this capability has yet to be exploited.

### Exploring 640 Mode

Most of the current application programs use 320 mode, though some program manufacturers are cautiously venturing into the virtually unexplored land of the 640 mode. For example, Infocom's Beyond Zork uses this mode. Because it is primarily a text-based application, the program does not require a lot of color flexibility.

By using super-high-resolution graphics in the 640 mode, Beyond Zork combines a crisp text display with a convenient on-screen graphics mapping facility. A gentle combination of colors is used, and color variation is effectively employed for highlighting and contrasting the computer's text from what was entered by the user.

At the opposite end of the spectrum, two entries from Mindscape purported to be IIGS applications are really nothing more than old IIe-style double-high-resolution graphics games that do not require a IIGS at all. Nor do these games make any attempt to use the IIGS' graphics capabilities.

Both of these games disappointed us; Gauntlet especially let us down. Even if you have not seen the stunning graphics used on the arcade version of Gauntlet, there are screen shots on the package — from other versions of the game running on other personal computers — that show a lot more detail and realism than the version designed supposedly for the IIGS.

## A Shareware Surprise

You should understand that good II GS graphics games don't necessarily have to come from major publishers. One game that effectively exploits both the II GS' graphics and sound capabilities is Bounce-It! from John Tierney. This program is shareware (\$10) and is available for downloading from most of the commercial telecommunications networks, as well as many local bulletin-board systems. The program's also been showing up on disks in users-group libraries.

Bounce-It! is an update of Breakout, the good old brick-bashing game that's done up in such a way as to show off the II GS' capabilities. The program makes use of different palettes on different lines to display more than the usual 16 colors on-screen. The result is one of the slickest II GS arcade games you'll find anywhere.


Accolade's Mean 18, a hot product when it first appeared, withstands the test of time. There is still a legion of fanatic players of the game, giving new meaning to the term "computer hacker." Online golf tournaments and an ever-increasing supply of user-designed golf courses help keep the game alive. Realistic sound effects help provide a sense of realism, and the "splash" when your ball hits the water is really disheartening. Sink a long putt, however, and the gallery's applause will definitely feed the ego.

Mean 18's graphics do a fine job of presenting a player with a view of the course that really gives a feel for depth. You can't help but believe how long a shot carried as you watch your ball and shadow travel down a fairway.

Screen motion is fairly rapid, considering there's so much detail. A minor drawback is that objects close to the on-screen player appear coarse; if your ball lands at the base of a tree, you may find yourself (in this case, the player on screen) facing a collection of large colored squares that make up an object not immediately recognizable as a tree.

Despite this very minor setback, Mean 18 does an excellent job with its graphics and, therefore, remains one of the few computer games that is frequently played by more than one player at a time.

## Graphics Done Wrong

Just because a game employs super-high-resolution graphics does not guarantee that they are used well. Games such as Sierra On-Line's "Quest" series (which includes Police Quest, King's Quest and King's Quest II) use simple line drawings and large fields of solid colors. Despite extensive use of simple animation, most of the screens in these games have the look of something whipped up in a few minutes with a standard paint program. Some of the Quest series games look almost like old IIe-style double-high-resolution graphics.

These particular games are all rich in play detail, with numerous things to do, places to go, treasures to acquire and so on. But the individual screens leave a lot to be desired when compared with the richness of the graphics images that we see in many other IIGS games.

Sierra's Mixed-Up Mother Goose is a game in the same vein as the Quest titles. It is aimed at children, however, and its simplistic imagery seems more suited for that audience. Experienced players of any of Quest titles will feel right at home playing this game with kids. All players will enjoy helping poor Mother

Goose attempt to reassemble her fractured fairy tales. This is done by locating misplaced objects from the various included rhymes.

Like the Quest series, this game does not show off the graphics power of the IIGS. But it does a fine job of entertaining young players, which is exactly why it was created.

## Graphics Done Right

In contrast, consider Cinemaware Corp.'s Defender Of The Crown. Set in medieval England, this game overflows with lavishly detailed graphics. Often a player wishes to pause the game just to look at the beautiful artwork for a little longer. Blend and texture are used for great effect here, from the colorful gaiety of the tournament bleachers to Robin Hood's gloomy Sherwood Forest at night to the subtle shading seen close up in people's faces.

The player cannot help but be drawn into the environment of the game by the realistically detailed look of the artwork. It is clear that the programmers and artists did their homework and produced a hauntingly authentic look for this game. The realism is

enhanced by the use of period mood music appropriately interspersed with the action on the screen.

Defender Of The Crown is one of the best showcases for the Apple IIGS from a visual standpoint. If you have a moment while sword-fighting in a castle entrance, take notice of the subdued shadows on the wall as you enter.

Datasoft/IntelliCreations' Tomahawk also has a lot happening on screen. As you fly your highly maneuverable combat helicopter, numerous readouts on your copter's control panel are updated, as is the 3-D view out the windshield. To help the program keep up with all of these busy graphics events, many of the objects seen outside the copter are represented as wire-frame-lined shapes. This does not detract from the game's playability, but it is noticeable and serves as a reminder that you are just playing a game.

## Aliens, Marbles And Pirates


In a class by itself is PBI Software's Alien Mind. Rich in smoothly scrolling graphics and featuring a continuing sound track, this arcade and strategy adventure — which has its roots

# Increase Your Apple IIGS Buying Power



**A**s an Apple IIGS owner, you know how useful your computer is. You also know that only one magazine — *The Apple IIGS Buyer's Guide* — concentrates exclusively on your machine.

in movies such as "Alien" — will amaze you with its imagery. You can run down corridors, dodge laser blasts or fight it out with robots — no wire frameworks here. Every object in Alien Mind is fully portrayed and drawn. A fast-moving game with fast-moving graphics to match, Alien Mind is a winner.

Aficionados of M.C. Escher will enjoy Electronic Arts' Marble Madness. Colorful, painstakingly detailed scrolling landscapes

flow past as you attempt to maneuver your marbles through what amounts to a 3-D maze. Each level has its own special eerie background music, and treachery awaits your marbles in the form of vacuum cleaners, ice-covered paths, roving predators, traps and pathways that appear and disappear seemingly at random. Frustrating at times, Marble Madness, with its elegant layouts, appeals to players of all ages.

*Pirates!* by MicroProse is a mixture of situational gaming. You wander through towns, sail your ship, do battle with other ships at sea and experience swashbuckling sword fights. Considering all the different activities included in *Pirates!*, the game does well with its visuals.

The best detail in *Pirates!* is seen in some of the smaller images that appear: your character's face and the faces of others, visuals of other ships passing at a distance, burning hulks slipping slowly beneath the waves en route to Davy Jones' Locker and more.

While sailing, you have an overhead view of your ship as it continues on course. Looking down upon your craft, you notice clouds drifting past. You also notice the shadows of the clouds upon the water. This simple, effective method of imparting a 3-D effect is also used during the battles between ships — as cannonballs fly, their shadows are visible on the water below them.

### Simple Backgrounds

In the overhead view, *Pirates!* uses a common technique for drawing a screen background that must be able to move in any direction. The terrain is represented by several squares filled with standard patterns. This makes screen updating fast and easy, because only the squares that change have to be redrawn.

This technique is also seen throughout *Questron II*, a swords-and-sorcery game that lets a user explore dungeons, get into hack-and-slash bouts with various weird creatures and seek the inevitable treasures that seem to lay scattered throughout the dungeons. Though somewhat trite in concept, *Questron II* looks good, moves fast and has lots of detail.

### Return Of The Classics

Sometimes you find unexpected (and clearly unplanned) surprises within games. Activision's pattern-matching game of *Shanghai* was one of the first games for the IIGS. *Shanghai*, a game with a fairly simple concept and superbly detailed graphics, immediately grabbed and held the attention of most IIGS users who tried it out. While game play is simple enough even for young children, its complex oriental-motif patterns are a bit hard for preschoolers to differentiate.

Fortunately, all of *Shanghai*'s tile patterns are stored on a simple 320-mode super-high-resolution picture file called *TILESET*. There are two *TILESET* files on the *Shanghai* disk, but both are the same. Either *TILESET* file can

be loaded into any IIGS paint program and modified to create a whole new set of tiles. Saving the new picture over both of the old ones puts the new tiles in place. As a result, several custom Shanghai tile sets are already making the rounds of bulletin boards and public-domain disks.

There's a set based on simple shapes that even a child can master. Another set is based on numbers, and there's even a Hebrew character tile set. Even the most jaded and burned-out Shanghai masters may find themselves captivated again with the addition of a new set of tiles for the game. If you do select other tile sets, be sure to replace the file TILE-SET in two places: in the root directory and in the /SYSTEM subdirectory. And, of course, *only* modify a backup disk! This is a bit tricky, because the disk is copy protected, but unprotected methods are available from several legitimate sources.

## Back From The U.S.S.R.

An amazing and addictive piece of software has found its way into our homes from the Soviet Union. Spectrum Holobyte is marketing Tetris, a game originally developed in the Soviet Union and reprogrammed domestically for several different computer types.

The Apple IIGS version excels with bright colors, clarity and Russian mood music. The playing field of Tetris is simplistic enough to obviate the need for powerful graphics, but that didn't stop the programmers. The playing field turns out to be a fairly small portion of the total screen. The programmers outdid themselves and created splendid background pictures of various scenes from Soviet life. A player is motivated to advance to higher levels just to see what the next picture will look like. A Tetris hint: make good use of the Pause feature.

Tetris is part of an insidious communist conspiracy designed to demoralize our technologically oriented, decadent, capitalistic imperialistic society by forcing us to remain at our computers! And it succeeds — once you get the feel for this game, you may find that days go by, meals are missed and loved ones and pets are scorned.

## Toward Tomorrow's Games

What can we make of all this? Well, there were great games from the first day the IIGS appeared. There were also mediocre ones. Both extremes still continue to appear. As time goes on and programmers learn more about the machine, there will be an increasing number of programs that push beyond anything we've seen before. Two years into

the life cycle of the IIGS, programs keep advancing the frontier of its performance.

Has the IIGS lived up to its potential in graphics? Of course not. No Apple II ever has; programmers keep finding new and amazing ways to program the machines. However, several of the programs mentioned

not only met our expectations, they exceeded them. We've been surprised and hope to be further astounded as the Apple IIGS continues to evolve. ■



## AppleCD SC

### The Computerized Compact Disc

The big revolution in the audio recording industry was the introduction of the audio CD recorder — the compact disc. The obvious extension to CD players, which already use digital data for sound, is to use compact discs for computer data storage. That's what Apple's new AppleCD drive is all about.

Most CD units are available as read-only devices. Units that can write or erase data are still too expensive for most consumer applications. Consequently, the AppleCD is referred to as a CD ROM drive. Because it attaches to an Apple II or Macintosh through the SCSI (Small Computer Systems Interface) port, its full name is the AppleCD SC ROM drive.

Apple's CD drive is a combination audio CD player and computer data reader. You can use the drive to play standard audio CDs through headphones or speakers or to read CDs that contain computer data. CDs can even be designed with both computer and audio data for interactive applications.

The AppleCD drive attaches to your Apple II GS through the Apple SCSI card. If you already have an Apple SCSI hard drive, then the CD drive can be attached (daisy chained) to the back of your hard drive. Early Apple SCSI cards required an upgrade to the Rev. C ROM update, available for free from Apple dealers.

The CD ROM "looks" like another SCSI drive to ProDOS. It's possible, however, to eject a compact disc under program command — much like a diskette — which is a function not available with hard drives. Two RCA phono jacks on the back of the drive and a mini stereo headphone jack are used for audio CDs.

The CD drive comes with two versions of the CD Remote program. One version is a desk accessory that operates via the mouse through the II GS desktop. The other is a stand-alone keyboard-oriented program that works with either an Apple IIe or II GS.

The CD Remote program looks like a typical audio CD remote control, complete with a timer and play selectors. You can choose to play selections in order or at random. Playing standard audio CDs is a bonus that you get with the AppleCD drive. After all, you wouldn't want to pay \$1,199 for an audio CD player that doesn't include a set of speakers, would you?

A CD ROM can theoretically store up to 656 MB of information — the equivalent of 270,000 pages of text. That's also equal to about 14 40 MB hard drives or 704 3.5-inch 800K diskettes. To put it in other terms, the CD drive can store the equivalent of 4,000 5.25-inch 143K diskettes.

The cost of a compact disc varies, depending on the data included. As with any program, book or other form of information, you aren't paying for the media, you're paying for the data. If enough copies are made — and if a manufacturer decides that the data should be distributed inexpensively — a computer CD can cost as little as an audio CD.

Producing a master for a CD ROM is fairly expensive. Few software companies will want to come out with different versions of CD ROM software for different computers (e.g., Apple II, Macintosh, IBM, etc.).

Fortunately, there is a solution to accessing data on different computers. A generic format called High Sierra is used by many CD ROMs. It provides a generalized system-independent format for storing data. A program designed to read the High Sierra format can be written for each computer, making distribution of data much easier.

There are already several CD ROMs available in the High Sierra format. Right now, however, there's no general-purpose High Sierra CD reader available for the Apple II family.

Most CDs come with a separate program — on a diskette — that is used to access the files stored on the CD. This program is usually optimized for the computer and the data on the CD to access information as quickly as possible. Occasionally, the program is included on the CD itself instead of on a separate disk.

There isn't much software currently available for the AppleCD drive in Apple II ProDOS format, because many vendors are waiting for new system software from Apple.

There's also a perception that few current Apple II applications need to access large amounts of data. This perception will change as more advanced Apple II applications become available, as CD production costs go down and as quantities increase.

Expect many companies to distribute customized CDs with large amounts of data for specific applications (e.g., phone books, reference sources, system catalogs, etc.). One such package, the Facts On File Public Domain Software CD, is already available for the Apple II. (See the review in this issue.)

Is it too early to buy into this technology? Possibly. We can't recommend the AppleCD SC ROM. There isn't enough software available right now. When software is released that is compatible with the Apple II, the AppleCD drive will be a worthwhile way to read large amounts of data, even without the write capability.

Just as audiocassette recorders and play-only units have applications in the audio field, CD ROMs will have applications in the computer industry.

## FingerPrint GSi Screen-Dump Graphics Board

FingerPrint GSi (Version 2.) is a screen-capture board and more. It works in conjunction with the IIGS printer, but is not, itself, a printer interface board.

Easy to install and simple to use, the board lets you interrupt any program in progress to capture and print — at the touch of a finger — whatever appears on screen, including text and all forms of IIGS graphics. Once the desired printing is completed, you return to the application your system is running. It's that straightforward.

When you press the red activator button, a bright red button that attaches to the IIGS, a variety of GSi features become available. Pull-down menus and optional mouse control give you access to several desktop accessories (e.g., a calculator, calendar and typewriter), graphics tools (inverse, color, zoom, rotate, flip, billboard and image cropping) and the printer manager (set margins, number of copies, top of form and print style).

Activate the FingerPrint board to convert low-resolution and high-resolution pictures to super-high-resolution for use with paint programs such as Paintworks Gold. Save captured images to disk and create a FingerPrint "slide show" (a computerized presentation of the captured images) with the special Slide Show program included in the package.

You can run the board in either DOS 3.3 or ProDOS, regardless of the operating system currently active in your IIGS. It's also possible to access the Disk Functions to catalog a specified disk; rename, delete or lock/unlock a file; or determine the amount of free space left on your data disk.

Installing the board takes only a few minutes. The user's manual is well written and includes several helpful illustrations.

The manual first directs you to insert the FingerPrint board into any slot. Because the board is transparent to the computer and does not have to be declared on the Control Panel,

its vendor — Thirdware Computer Products — recommends placing it in Slot 3. This slot is normally left vacant, so the board does not consume valuable space inside the computer.

Once installed, configure the dip switch settings on the board to match your printer type. FingerPrint is compatible with many printers, including the new ImageWriter LQ (letter quality).

Next, attach the activator button to the board (it may already be connected), drape the blue ribbon cable over the IIGS case so that the red button rests on a flat surface at the front of the computer.

Finally, replace the IIGS' lid and affix the activator button on the computer case to keep it out of harm's way. The GSi board is now installed and ready to use.

As mentioned, interrupting a program to print a text screen is simple. Just press the red button and select Print Screen from the Main menu. The FingerPrint board is capable of capturing two text pages, four low-resolution pages, four high-resolution pages, two double-high-resolution images and one super-high-resolution image.

If a printed image is not an exact replica of the image on screen, choose Scan Screen from the File menu and move the mouse or arrow keys until the appropriate video image appears. Then press Return. This "sets" the screen, and you are now ready to print.

Images may be printed in color if you have a color ribbon. If you do not have a color ribbon, Thirdware Computer Products recommends choosing the color option anyway, because the board will then print a high-contrast image in multiple shades of gray.

We disagree. In our opinion, the color printing option creates an inverse of the original screen image. Moreover, printing in "color" takes longer, because the printer head makes four passes on each line — one pass for every color in a four-color ribbon.

Teachers who use FingerPrint GSi in the classroom will find the board useful for a variety of tasks. Applications with great graphics but no printing capabilities can now be used to create activity sheets.

Reader Rabbit IIGS (The Learning Company) is a case in point, as is Clock Works (MECC). Both programs offer screen shots that would make terrific student work sheets. Dinosaur Dog (Mindscape) contains pictures of more than 30 dinosaurs, but offers no way

to make hard copies. With FingerPrint GSi, you can print out a Tyrannosaurus rex the size of a billboard.

FingerPrint GSi works almost flawlessly. As long as you remember that super-high-resolution images are displayed in a screen graphics mode at a resolution higher than most printers are capable of printing, you won't be too disappointed if your hard copy is not a perfect reproduction.

Also, if you change your mind about printing once a screen dump is in progress, there is no way to cancel the print operation and return to your software application without rebooting the computer.

We had some trouble dumping screen shots of the product's own menu bar, as well as graphics created in MagnaCharta from Third Wave Technology. Technical support at Thirdware Computer Products indicated that the problem is the fault of our LQ printer, which does not emulate the ImageWriter II exactly. The LQ lacks the ability to deal with mouse text. The next version of FingerPrint is expected to be fully graphics based. This will take care of the LQ problem.

Another potential cause for concern — especially in a classroom setting — is the red activator button. How do you keep little hands from playing with the button and constantly interrupting an ongoing application? While FingerPrint GSi does come with a five-year guarantee, damage caused by accident or misuse is not covered.

FingerPrint GSi is a versatile board that brings a much needed graphics output function to a computer whose major *raison d'être* is quality graphics.

Congratulations Thirdware on a job (for the most part) well done.



Even though a mouse is a great device for selecting menu items, it makes an awkward tool for drawing. A much better tool is a digitizing tablet such as the Kurta IS/GS. A digitizing tablet, which is more precise than a mouse, provides greater control when creating images.

The Kurta IS/GS will work with any 8- or 16-bit program that recognizes a mouse. The tablet comes complete with a manual, software driver and corded stylus. (A stylus is a pen-like device that is used with the tablet to electronically draw on a computer screen. Depressing the point of the stylus produces the same results as clicking the mouse button.)



*This digitizing pad from Kurta enables the creator to draw more precisely than is possible with a mouse.*

A cordless stylus, or puck, is available separately. The working surface of the tablet is 8.5 inches by 11 inches.

Thanks to the Apple Desktop Bus (ADB), anyone can connect the Kurta tablet with ease. Merely plug it into the ADB interface port, then connect the keyboard and mouse to the tablet. Everything connected to the ADB port will remain active and can be used interchangeably. The actual order in which

devices are connected to the ADB port can be determined by a user. This means that the tablet can be used with equal ease by a right- or left-handed user.

The Kurta IS/GS can be set for either Absolute or Relative mode. Absolute mode means that every point on the tablet always corresponds to a point on the screen. Placing the stylus in the upper right corner of the tablet will always position the cursor in the upper right corner of the screen. Relative mode imitates the way a mouse is used to position the cursor on the screen and can, therefore, cause some frustration.

While in Absolute mode, a user can place templates, preliminary drawings or photographs on the tablet or under its clear plastic cover to electronically trace the image or select menu items. This speeds up the drawing process and allows for greater freedom. All images electronically traced to the screen are slightly compressed horizontally. This could cause trouble if you are using a program such as TopDraw and need greater precision.



A user can determine whether the Kurta tablet will be in the Relative or Absolute mode by installing a software driver as a desktop accessory (DA) on all 16-bit IIGS programs that use the Apple menu. If the DA is added to a disk — Kurta supplies a program that does this easily — then the user only needs to pull down the Apple menu and select the DA named Penworks. The user can then choose whether the tablet will be in the Absolute or Relative mode.

After the DA is added to an application program disk, the tablet will automatically be in Absolute mode when the program is started.

Unfortunately, the Kurta IS/GS is not without bugs. On several occasions the tablet would seemingly deactivate itself or the program would crash without warning. We were assured by a representative at Kurta that it is working on the problem and that the trouble lies not in the tablet, but in the software driver.

The Kurta IS/GS carries a limited lifetime warranty.

Even with its occasional bugs, the Kurta IS/GS is still an excellent tool that will instantly increase the users' productivity with paint, draw and computer-aided design (CAD) software. In short, the Kurta IS/GS makes it easier to create images on your IIGS.







more expensive. Instead of getting a full 1 MB memory board for your IIGS when you purchase it, you might want to get a small memory expansion board at first and expand as you need the extra memory.

There's one more complication for new IIGS owners. Apple Computer now ships a 256K memory expansion board with every new Apple IIGS. So why should you be interested in purchasing a third-party board in addition to your current board? The primary reason is to purchase a board with extra capabilities, usually more memory. MultiRam IIGS can be expanded to 2 MB of memory, twice as much memory as Apple's board.

Another reason to get a third-party board is to use it with a battery backup system. We reviewed Checkmate Technology's own MemorySaver (reviewed in our Winter '88 issue) and Applied Engineering's RamKeeper (reviewed in our Summer '88 issue). MultiRam GS can be plugged into MemorySaver, which then plugs into the IIGS' memory expansion slot. Result: memory that stays intact, even with the power switched off.

At first glance, MultiRam IIGS looks like an Apple Memory expansion card. However, the Checkmate board has room for five rows of memory, where Apple's board only has room for four rows. In addition, the fifth row of Checkmate's board uses special high-density memory chips. The first four rows of MultiRam IIGS use standard 256K RAM chips, like most other IIGS memory boards. The last row uses either special 256K RAMs (available only from Checkmate), for a total of 1.25 MB of memory, or standard 1 MB RAMs, for a total of 2 MB.

If you have a 1 MB MultiRam IIGS board and can't afford to upgrade all the way to 2 MB, then you can purchase the special 256K RAMs that fit into the 1 MB sockets from

Checkmate. When you want to upgrade to the 1 MB chips, Checkmate will give you full credit for the special 256K chips.

Overall, the step-by-step expansion is more complicated and may prove to be more expensive in the long run. Yet, it's also a more affordable method to upgrade memory right now. You add memory only as you find programs that require more memory.

Two jumpers on the board are used to tell the board how much memory you have installed, and the manual gives clear directions showing you how to set up the jumpers. A diagnostic program tells you if there's any bad or suspect RAM on the board.

There is a minor technical problem with the board if you expand beyond 1 MB of RAM. Certain boards for the IIGS use a special memory access technique called DMA (direct memory access). If you have more than 1 MB of memory on your MultiRam IIGS and have a DMA board designed for the IIGS, then there may be an interference problem between the two boards. Currently, the only DMA board for the IIGS that has a problem is the AST Vision Plus; however, there may be more DMA boards in the future.

Any IIGS memory board with 1 MB of memory or less is automatically DMA compatible. Most boards with more than 1 MB won't work properly with DMA boards, but there are exceptions, such as Applied Engineering's GS-RAM and GS-RAM Plus boards. For most users, though, the DMA issue is a minor problem and should not interfere with normal operation.

Overall, MultiRam IIGS is an adequate and competitively priced memory expansion board. If you want 2 MB in your IIGS, this is a cost-effective way to get it. ■

### Copy II Plus Disk Utilities And More

When you purchase software and documentation, it is rarely yours to do with as you please. In most cases, the manufacturer grants you restricted rights to operate the software on a single machine. As a result, unauthorized duplication for your friends, family or anyone else is strictly forbidden.

The copyright law, however, gives you the right to make an archival or backup copy of the original disk for your own use, as a safeguard against accidental erasure or software malfunction.

Copy II Plus from Central Point Software will help you accomplish this goal. It is designed to secure your Apple II software investment by enabling you to make personal backups of copy protected programs, as well as unprotected programs.

Copy II Plus is not intended as a way to beat copy protection, nor is it being marketed for unauthorized software distribution.

Version 8.3 of Copy II Plus comes with two disks and a manual. The 3.5-inch disk contains several DOS 3.3/ProDOS utilities and two bit-type copy programs to back up 5.25-inch and 3.5-inch disks. The 5.25-inch disk does not include the 3.5-inch bit copy program because of space limitations.

Copy II Plus is menu driven and does not support a mouse. Users make selections by moving the cursor with the arrow keys and pressing Return. The bit copy programs are easy to operate and flexible enough to overcome several current copy protection schemes. The backup task often is handled automatically. All you have to do is select Auto Copy and type in the name of the program you wish to copy.

If a file for that program exists, Copy II Plus loads the parameters (copying values), and all you have to do is press Return. If the resulting backup disk does not work, you may need to recopy only a few tracks.

When this happens, select Partial Auto Copy, choose the range of tracks you wish to re-copy and the program will fill in the rest of the parameters. If a parameter file for a program does not exist, Copy II Plus offers several "try this" entries.

The Copy II Plus bit copy programs won't let you make backups of all copy protected programs. For example, we could not duplicate IIGS versions of Information Laboratory (Addison-Wesley) or Multiscribe GS, Version 3.0C (Scholastic School Edition). Nor was it possible to back up the 5.25-inch versions of Where In Europe Is Carmen Sandiego (Broderbund), GEOS (Berkeley Softworks) or the Sesame Street Crayon Series (Polarware).

Still, we were able to back up a number of popular programs. These include: ShowOff and The Print Shop IIGS (Broderbund); Reader Rabbit (The Learning Co.); virtually all MECC programs (e.g., Calendar Crafter and Clock Works); Davidson's skill builders with the Early Learner Desktop Interface; Softswitch (Roger Wagner Publishing, Inc.); Talking Text Writer (Scholastic); and Math Masters Series (DLM).

Several parameter entries under Auto Copy for the 3.5-inch bit copy program contain the designation "HD," which stands for hard disk. These files modify the backup disk so that the protected program may be transferred to a hard disk. When you are ready to make the transfer, simply call up the Copy Files option from the Utilities menu.

The manual offers helpful tips for those times when the parameters don't seem to work or when there are no parameters listed for the program you wish to copy. First and foremost, keep trying. If you have two disk drives, reverse the direction of the copy so that drive two serves as the source disk and drive one is the destination disk.

If the original 5.25-inch disk is write protected, place a write-protect tab on the duplicate disk prior to booting it up. If none of these tricks work, you may need to enter new parameters to back up the original program.

For the technically minded, the Manual Bit Copy and Manual Sector Copy programs can be used to unprotect many programs that Copy II Plus may not recognize in its parameter file. The ability to take advantage of all the program's features often requires a good knowledge of hexadecimal notation, bytes

and ASCII, so don't become too frustrated if you are not able to get beyond simple manual bit and sector copy procedures.

Apple II owners with memory expansion cards in numbered computer slots will be happy to know that Copy II Plus has a built-in Memory Manager to access the added memory. With extra memory, the program can read and write several tracks at a time.

If your computer has only one disk drive, you will really appreciate this feature, because fewer disk swaps are needed to copy unprotected disks or bit copy 3.5-inch disks. If your memory card is installed in the auxiliary slot of your computer, you must configure the card as a RAM disk before Copy II Plus can take advantage of it.

In addition to the bit copy programs, Copy II Plus contains several utilities. The selection includes utilities to format a disk; rename, delete or undelete a file; catalog a disk with or without file lengths; alphabetize the catalog or its directory; convert files between DOS and ProDOS; check drive speed; verify that the disk and its files are readable; lock or unlock a file; view and print files; and more.

Copy II Plus may not be the most powerful bit copy program on the market. Nevertheless, it's sophisticated enough to handle some heavily protected DOS 3.3 and ProDOS software. Considering that you also get several good utilities at no extra charge, it's not surprising that more than 250,000 copies of Copy II Plus have been sold to date.

## Design Your Own Home, Architecture

Be The Next Frank Lloyd Wright

Design Your Own Home, Architecture has the potential to bring computer-aided design (CAD) software out of architects' and engineers' offices and onto the desktops of Apple IIGS users.


Although Abracadata has been selling an 8-bit Apple II version of this software for several years, the new II GS version has been completely re-written to take full advantage of the II GS' user interface and superior graphics. This new version, which requires an Apple II GS with 768K of RAM, is supplied on one 3.5-inch disk.

If used with an ImageWriter II, the II GS version has color printing capabilities. The program is not copy protected, and users are encouraged by its well-written manual to make a backup copy or to transfer the program to a hard disk.

Users of Design Your Own Home, Architecture can draw floor plans, create side views of buildings and add structural details to their creations. Like the title says, the hobbyist home designer can use this program to create a dream home and print out the plans, using standard architectural design symbols that a building contractor can use as a first step toward building the home.

Be aware, however, that the program does *not* create blueprints. Nevertheless, it can be used to create drawings of such detail that it should be easy for an architect to use the plans as a model for creating the needed blueprints.

On the surface, Design Your Own Home, Architecture is a powerful and specialized object-oriented drawing program. What distinguishes it from other object-oriented software is its close relationship to real-world measurements. You can, for example, employ rulers and grids to help line up objects correctly. You can also show measurements in feet and inches or use the metric scale.

In addition, there's a convenient pull-down measurement information feature that allows you to easily determine the length, width and area of any drawn object. You can create an object or floor plan, and the program will determine the area in square feet. This information can be used to approximate the amount of lumber needed to build a particular project.

Several dozen predrawn sample floor plans of popular home styles are included. Also on the disk are many predrawn objects that are found in all homes, such as doors, windows and bathroom fixtures. By using the pull-down menus, it's easy to alter these objects, so even if a drawing is not exactly right, a few mouse clicks can change the objects to suit a user's needs.

In addition, Design Your Own Home comes with many predrawn patterns that can be used to fill the area of objects. Besides standard choices, some of the more exotic patterns look like brick, wood panels and aluminum siding. You can also easily blend colors to produce plans from a selection of 4,096 colors.

It's easy to create floor plans from scratch or to create entire libraries of objects. As an example, you can draw furniture, appliances or decks and use the program to lay out the design of a garden or a living room.

An hour after first running this program, we designed a fence that we'd been dreaming about for a year. We knew how much wood would be required to build the fence and were able to easily determine all of the measurements.

Running the program from the Finder, a user will see a familiar looking desktop with the now-standard layout of tools shown in a menu bar on the left. Using the mouse, the user can click on a number of Tool functions and start designing a project from scratch.

Default measurement values can be changed anytime, with any object or floor plan being re-scaled automatically to the new measurement. When first running the program and loading in a floor plan, the plan is drawn to a scale of 1/8 inch = 1 foot. Using that scale, a user can have a plan up to 64 feet in length. By re-sizing the measurements to 1/32 of an inch = 1 foot, it's possible to draw objects that are up to 256 feet in length. The maximum width is 10,000 feet.

In ensuing months, the vendor plans to release several additional modules to be used in conjunction with Design Your Own Home, Architecture, including an interior-design module and a landscaping module. Also planned are additional architectural library disks.

## Designasaurus

Back To The Bogs

Begin with an irresistible topic — dinosaurs. Add vivid super-high-resolution graphics, colorful animation, true-to-life sound effects and a toe-tapping musical overture. Designasaurus for the II GS is the result. The IBM PC edition won the 1987 "Best Educational Program" and the "Best Pre-School or Primary Program" categories of the Software Publisher's Association's Excellence in Software Awards. The new, improved II GS version was released at AppleFest Boston in May 1988.

Designasaurus comes on three 800K disks — a boot disk and two application disks. The disks are configured at 792K, 798K and 784K respectively. It's no wonder the program takes more than three minutes to load into memory. Individuals with a one-drive system should be prepared for some disk swapping.

You will need 1 MB of extended memory — rather than the 768K stipulated in the program manual — to run Designasaurus and print out successfully. Your IIGS must be equipped with 1 MB of RAM over and above the 256K that came with the machine. This requirement is unfortunate in an age when added RAM is both expensive and in short supply, but it's not uncommon for ProDOS 16 software designed to take full advantage of the graphics and sound capabilities of the IIGS.

Designasaurus is filled with dinosaur pictures and information designed to make natural history come alive for kids ages 4 and up. The program offers three entertaining activities: Print-a-Dino; Build-a-Dino; and the Walk-a-Dino adventure game. Preschoolers probably will enjoy the first activity the most, because the other activities require reading skills and well-developed hand-eye coordination.

In Print-a-Dino, children select a dinosaur from a list of 12 and then print out a picture of their chosen "terrible lizard" on an ImageWriter II or LQ (letter quality) printer.

Contrary to what the program's printer dialog box may claim, Designasaurus has no driver for the LaserWriter. In addition, none of its applications support color printing. However, the black and white pictures are so well done that kids will enjoy brightening them up with crayons, markers or colored pencils.

All of the popular dinosaurs are represented, including triceratops, brontosaurus, diplodocus, Tyrannosaurus rex, stegosaurus, pterodactyl and ankylosaurus. Even a few of the not-so-well-known giant reptiles have made the program's list — megalosaurus, parasaurolophus, archaeopteryx, iguanodon and camptosaurus.

To select a dinosaur for viewing or printing, point and double-click the mouse on the animal of your choice. Designasaurus does not support a joystick.

While printing options are many, each option must be carried out in Draft mode. Select Regular for an 8.5- by 11-inch printout. With this option, you also get a description of

the chosen dinosaur. Unfortunately, you cannot view the accompanying text prior to printing it or choose to print either the picture or the text.

Select Poster for a hard copy that's four times the regular size. The poster prints on four separate sheets. You'll have to do some cutting and pasting to get the papers to align properly, however.

The T-shirt option lets you print a mirror image of a dinosaur, which is perfect for ironing onto material of your choice. The package includes a single sheet of T-shirt transfer paper to help you get started. An order form for additional "Print 'n Wear" paper is included.

To build a dinosaur, kids visit the program's Museum of Natural History. There they find a bearded paleontologist who's eager to dispense fossils from a three-drawer file cabinet labeled Head, Body and Tail. Click on one of the drawers, and the scientist gives the cabinet a kick. You hear the distinct sounds of broken glass and a cuckoo clock. A new screen appears with the correct fossil portion for a specific dinosaur.

Listen to the sounds of a typewriter as a fact sheet comes into view with information describing the period in which the dinosaur lived, its Order and Family classification and other important general facts about the animal.

If you wish to view another fossil in the same Head, Body or Tail category, or stop the typing in midstream, click on Next. If you like the fossil you see, click on Add. You will then be returned to the museum to select another body part.

There are body parts for each of the program's 12 dinosaurs, although not all parts of all dinosaurs are represented. The fact sheet for each dinosaur is the same no matter what fossil part you select. You may mix and match fossils from different dinosaurs.

When the reconstruction is completed, give the dinosaur a name and print it out Regular, Poster or T-shirt size.

Prior to printing, you will see a Museum of Natural History Field Report describing your dinosaur. The report can be viewed, but not printed out.

When our 8-year-old assistant designed a "Triceratopteryx," the report informed him that his animal contained the massive head of the triceratops (herbivore), the large, bat-like wings of the pterodactyl (carnivore) and the delicate tail of the archaeopteryx (insectivore). The report concluded that this animal might have some trouble deciding on a diet.

We printed a copy of the dinosaur in any case.

## Fractal Explorer

Math-Based Graphics

Remember the kaleidoscope you had when you were a kid and how you wished you could save the designs to look at again? Fractal Explorer is a graphics program that allows you to create beautiful, lacy kaleidoscopic designs on a IIGS screen and save them to use in automatic slide shows.

Fractal Explorer is based on a relatively new mathematical principle discovered only in the last 20 years or so. The program uses calculations of complex — or imaginary — numbers to determine the color of each pixel in a drawing.

From an initial drawing, a user can zoom in virtually any number of times to create blowups of certain portions of that drawing. Zoomed drawings can also be increased in size, up to a practical limit of about 10 times. This limit has nothing to do with the program's ability to manage the calculations. Rather, it's based on the length of time it can take to create the drawing.

Because calculations must be made pixel by pixel — and the number of calculations increases at each zoom level — drawings can take a long time to create. The fastest drawing we did took a couple of hours. The program user's guide says that drawings zoomed 10 times can take more than 12 hours to complete. It took us more than 24 hours to complete a drawing zoomed at level seven.


While we occasionally found ourselves in front of the screen watching the pixels bloom into color, most often we selected the area we wanted to draw and let the computer work by itself. Our frustration, of course, was that we couldn't use the computer for other tasks while it was calculating. Usually, we let the machine make its calculations overnight.

Fractal Explorer is easy to operate. The program is entirely menu driven, though it doesn't support the Apple IIGS' pull-down menus. All selections may be made with either the keyboard or the mouse. To zoom a new picture, for example, you select the starting picture and move the selector box over the area you want by using either the arrow keys or the mouse.

Although it can take a long time to create pictures, you can stop the process at anytime, save a picture as it is and resume creating it later. We found it annoying that the program accesses the disk after each operation. For example, when we stopped to save a part of a drawing, the program had to retrieve the drawing from the disk before continuing to draw.

The real fun with Fractal Explorer is watching the special effects of the drawings as they cycle through in the slide show. The Main menu offers two basic options: make a drawing or run a slide show. Either selection brings up another menu.

The Fractal Explorer disk comes with the program itself and 17 pictures that can be shown in a slide show. The Slide Show menu offers a number of options that allow a user to program a number of repetitions. A slide show can run once, run continuously or be repeated as many as nine times.

From this menu, a user can also program color effects for the drawings. The program uses the II GS' super-high-resolution capabilities to display drawings with a variety of color selections. Single-color palettes are available, as are several multicolored palettes. It's even possible to cycle waves of colors through a drawing toward or away from the center to create some spectacular special effects.

The Create Fractal Image menu provides an option that allows a user to create a working disk that holds only the program and the first drawing. An 800K disk can hold about 18 drawings. This capability saves having to make a backup disk and delete all the unwanted drawings.

Fractal Explorer allows a user to open pictures from a II GS paint program and make changes. But don't do what we did and save a drawing from the paint program with the same file name. You'll discover that the necessary mathematical information is lost and that you can no longer zoom drawings from the picture in Fractal Explorer. If you want to save changes, be sure to use the Save As command and give the file another name. Even though the mathematical information was lost, we were still able to use the drawing in our slide shows.

Though Fractal Explorer does not provide a printing function, we were able to print our drawings in color on an ImageWriter II with a color ribbon and Paintworks Plus. Of course, the ImageWriter doesn't come close to matching the resolution of a II GS screen. According to the user's guide, any paint program that uses a \$C1 file can load and alter Fractal Explorer pictures.

The vendor says Fractal Explorer is an entertainment/educational program and has included the equations upon which the program is based in the user's guide. High school advanced math analysis students should be

able to comprehend these equations. Unfortunately, we think the educational value of the program is diminished by the fact that the mathematical calculations take place entirely in the background. A student who wants to manipulate the math has no access to the program's calculations.

While Fractal Explorer may motivate a particularly interested individual to further explore the mathematical principles involved, we doubt that most users will be interested in the math behind the program. Nevertheless, all users will appreciate the spectacular images Fractal Explorer produces.



The Graphics Supermarket comes with a user's manual and one unprotected 3.5-inch disk. Interestingly enough, it's possible to purchase the source code for the program separately.



#### A few words about cost.

Compare the price of a PC Transporter — you'll find it about on par with even the cheapest, stripped-down IBM clones.

Then consider that your PC Transporter gives the Apple peripherals you already own the power to work



The minimum required memory configuration needed to run the program is 512K, but more is recommended. Both the ImageWriter II and LaserWriter printers are supported.

A major portion of the user's manual describes the program's painting functions. Sample programs are given for Applesoft, assembly and C. Because The Graphics Supermarket is best used as a programming aid, we would have preferred seeing more suggestions and examples included.

The program's painting tools include Undo, Erase, Sketch, Spray, Fill, Line, Rectangles, Ovals and Arcs. Horizontal and vertical semi-circles can also be drawn. There are seven different rectangular pen sizes available in The Graphics Supermarket, but the pen shapes cannot be modified. The Magnify mode allows for seven levels of magnification.

The Graphics Supermarket uses Frames to create active windows for editing and painting. The ability to create various-size windows is especially helpful for programmers who need to add small images to their programs.

Frame size can be determined by dragging a corner of a Frame or by inputting the size numerically. The size of a Frame can range from 1 byte by 1 byte to 160 by 200 bytes (a full screen). Frames can be scrolled and flipped horizontally or vertically.


Up to 15 different Frames can be held on the Clipboard. This feature is one of Graphic Supermarket's strong points, but it requires extra memory to fully use. We used a 1 MB RAM board and found that the feature worked extremely well.

The 16 colors in the program's palette can be changed by determining the amount of red, green and blue (RGB) in a selected color. However, we missed the alternative method of defining color by adjusting the hue, saturation and intensity (HSI) found in other programs.

Colors can be copied and switched between positions on the palette. Color gradations can be produced, too, but your color choices are not entirely up to you. The gradations must be between a color on the palette and limited variations of RGB.

An Animation Test is included so that programmers can try out animations, but the program doesn't support any other animation tools.

The Graphics Supermarket has an extensive Status menu that gives the width and height of the Edit window in bytes and pixels. Also displayed is the byte size of the Clipboard, the total amount of system memory, and the amount of RAM available and used.

Pictures created in The Graphics Supermarket can be saved as either binary images or paint (\$C1) images. Pictures created with other paint programs can be loaded into The Graphics Supermarket, but they must be in binary format.

A powerful program feature allows you to save the Clipboard as either binary or source code in assembly or C. Source-code files created with The Graphics Supermarket are compatible with the Apple Programmer's Workshop (APW).

Clipboard images can also be saved with or without color tables or masked. When a masked image is produced, the background color is interpreted as transparent.

To provide a learning tool and more examples for IIGS programming, a source-code disk, available separately, contains the C source-code files used to create The Graphics Supermarket. To compile these files, you will need at least 1 MB of RAM, the APW and two 3.5-inch disk drives. The files on the source-code disk are copyrighted.

If you are looking for a IIGS painting program, you will probably want something with more power than The Graphics Supermarket. But if you need something to elevate the tedium of creating images for use in your own Applesoft, assembly or C language programs, then The Graphics Supermarket would be an excellent buy.

## Paintworks Gold

More Power For Paint

Don't expect great works of art from a new artistic medium. The invention of oil-based paint in the 15th century, for example, gave artists greater control over brighter colors. But for generations artists continued painting by the rules they had followed with fresco and tempera. The development of motion picture technology early in the 20th century offered tremendous new possibilities for artistic creativity, but for years film directors simply pointed stationary cameras at stage plays.

By now, we should be seeing masterpieces of computer art — digital Rembrandts, Van Goghs and Picassos. We haven't, largely because the best work in computer graphics is in advertising illustration (a very different context from the palaces, churches, cafes and lunatic asylums where artistic creativity flourished in the past).

Paintworks Plus from Activision, Inc. (a.k.a., Mediagenic) was the first graphics package written specifically for the Apple IIGS. It closely followed the MacPaint model and included super-high-resolution colors. The product suffered from some bugs in the first release (which were later corrected) and non-standard file formats. When Electronic Arts released DeluxePaint II, ported over from the Amiga with an impressive array of features, Paintworks Plus began to look pale in comparison. Paintworks Gold, with some 80 new features, is the next salvo in this escalating feature war.


All this graphics power comes at a price. Paintworks Gold requires memory — a whopping 1.25 MB. This means you need the basic 256K that comes with the IIGS, plus a fully populated 1 MB RAM expansion board.

Another part of the price is loading time. All PRODOS 16 applications take the same tedious amount of time from a cold boot to reach the Program Launcher, so we started the timer when we clicked Open. The time from click to draw (when the mouse cursor

appears) took exactly two minutes. Not quite enough for a coffee break, but still a long time to stare at a screen.

You need at least one 3.5-inch drive, but a second drive is a great convenience. It is possible to save a drawing to a ProDOS 5.25-inch disk, which is something the instruction manuals never mention. Because most II GS owners only have one drive of each kind (3.5 and 5.25), they learn to get by with what they have.

The program's list price, \$99.95, is not excessive for an application of this quality. Many users will get an even better deal by upgrading to Paintworks Gold from *any* other II GS paint program for only \$40 (plus \$3.50 shipping and handling — and 6.5 percent sales tax in California). To get the upgrade, you need only tear out the original first page of the manual from your present II GS paint program and send it, along with a check, to Paintworks Upgrade, PO Box T, Gilroy, CA 95021-2249.

The Paintworks Gold package includes the program disk, a disk of clip art and a spiral-bound 146-page manual. The pull-down menus in the program practically groan under the weight of their excessive number of options. Some of the menus nearly drop to the bottom of the screen!

The keyboard shortcuts are a great time saver. We kept wishing for a quick reference card, because the program is so complex. Well, we found one, cleverly disguised as a desk accessory labeled Help.

Of all the riches the program offers, the nicest is a complete second page for drawing (it's Page 2 that requires so much extra memory). You can use Page 2 as a scratch pad to try out ideas. You can copy between pages or even use Page 2 as a background for whatever you draw on Page 1. The trick is done with simple commands under the Goodies menu.

Paintworks Gold has wonderful gradient fill tools that let you smoothly blend and shade colors across an area. There is a new Cotton tool icon that modifies the action of the paintbrush to smear or smooth out everything in its path. FatBits, the zoom magnifier, now has its own range of options, including four levels of magnification.

Your artwork may look great on screen, but until you put it on paper, few people will ever get to enjoy it. So hard copy is an important part of any graphics package. Along with Apple's standard ImageWriter and LaserWriter drivers, Paintworks Gold adds an Epson printer driver, which supports the Grappler Plus graphics card or Parallel Pro interface. The color-ribbon option for certain Epson models is not supported, however, so the ImageWriter II is still the only way to get color output — unless you want to point a camera at the monitor and take snapshots.

Incompatible graphics file formats are an endless source of frustration for Apple II artists. The only consolation is that the situation is even worse in the IBM PC world. The original Paintworks Plus program saved screens or pages in a non-standard format that most other programs could not recognize. The screen format is 320 pixels wide by 200 pixels high. Paint format is 320 pixels wide by 396 pixels high. Paintworks Gold still supports these formats. It also lets you save drawings in the Apple Preferred format, which, even though it takes more disk space, lets you import an image easily into other IIGS programs.

A spiral-bound 150-page user manual is divided into Tutorial and Reference sections. (This is increasingly accepted by technical writers as the best way to organize software documentation.) The manual is well-illustrated and indexed.

There is a tear-out proof-of-ownership page thoughtfully provided for future upgrades. Someday, when the IIGS gets the higher-resolution video modes it so desperately needs, all graphics programs will need to be upgraded.

Paintworks Gold is the current high-end graphics champ in the IIGS arena. It has much the same power and flexibility as DeluxePaint II, but is easier to use and follows the Apple Human Interface Guidelines more closely. It is also a true bargain, if you can take advantage of the upgrade offer. It is still a complex package, and most users will need plenty of practice to unlock its power.

Nobody is going to do serious art on an Apple IIGS. Professional graphics require workstations in the \$10,000 to \$100,000 range. A good monitor or film recorder could easily cost more than a complete IIGS system. But just as you can learn to paint or draw without a fully equipped studio, you can learn a lot about computer graphics with inexpensive hardware and software. You can make beautiful images to share with your friends.

Conventional graphics are expensive, often messy and sometimes toxic. Electrons, on the other hand, are cheap, and photons are free.

writer Theodore Sturgeon, 90 percent of everything is junk.

There is one major advantage to public-domain software: a user can legally give out program copies to other computer users. Unlike normal copyrighted programs, public-domain programs can be distributed among many users. This makes the Facts On File CD ROM format especially nice for a school. One Apple II can be set up in the school library with a CD drive. Each student can download programs, as needed, to normal diskettes.

The Facts On File CD comes with a program-selector application on a diskette; both 5.25- and 3.5-inch disks are supplied. We wonder why the company decided to put the program selector on a separate diskette, instead of putting it onto the CD ROM along with the other programs.

Most of the programs will operate directly off of the CD ROM. Programs that have to write data to the disk or use a special operating system, however, must be downloaded to a diskette before they can be used properly.

All of the programs operate on any Apple II computer, and none of them take advantage of the IIGS' enhanced capabilities. In fact, at least one program on the compact disc only works with earlier Apple IIs and won't operate properly on an enhanced IIe, IIc or IIGS.

Several of the programs cause unusual problems on the IIGS. Among them are programs that use counting loops for timers where the IIGS operates too fast (e.g., clock simulators, stop watch, etc.). While none of the online documentation mentions it, you can set your IIGS Control Panel speed to Slow to operate these programs properly.

Many of the supplied programs were written before Apple IIs accepted lowercase (1983) text. Consequently, these programs haven't the faintest idea of what you're typing when you enter a lowercase word. As a general rule, leave your Caps Lock key on when running any of these programs, unless you specifically need to enter lowercase text.

When you boot the program-selector disk, it gives you a set of choices by categories and a description of each program. If a program requires a special operating system or needs to be transferred to a diskette, that's noted in the description. Each program includes its own online documentation where necessary.

In the case of many programs, the documentation assumes that you already know how to use your computer. Some beginning

Facts On File's Public Domain Software is the first Apple II software to be marketed on a CD ROM, and the company proudly proclaims that anyone who buys it will be paying an average of less than \$2 per program for the 100-program collection. Unfortunately, while there are good programs on this CD, very few of them are worth more than \$2 and several are worth much less.

Public-domain programs are programs the authors decide to distribute to the public at large, without expecting payments. Why do program authors do this? A programmer may be trying out new ideas that aren't polished enough for a commercial product; a program may have been written as part of a school project; or the author may have decided that the program isn't sophisticated enough to justify its marketing costs.

Although there are some diamonds in the rough, many public-domain programs are crude and simple. They may have been written as freebies for user groups or computer stores or as simple examples for beginning programming courses. To paraphrase Sturgeon's law, first proposed by science-fiction

users will find the programs difficult to use because of the lack of adequate documentation or support.

Facts On File claims that there are no bugs in the programs. Nevertheless, we found at least two, including one in the menu program. Other programs have more serious bugs, which may result in unexpected crashes.

The biggest irony about this Public-Domain library is that it isn't that large and doesn't justify being placed on a CD ROM disc. The entire CD, with 200 programs, could have been distributed on three 800K 3.5-inch diskettes. Less than 1 percent of the CD's full capacity is used; the rest is unused space.

Here are some examples of programs that are on the CD ROM:

There are several good programs that we found interesting and useful. FreeWriter is a simple word processing program written by the author of the popular AppleWriter program. While FreeWriter isn't as powerful, it's adequate for producing simple letters and memos. If this is all the capability you need, then FreeWriter is much less expensive than a commercial word processing program.

The William Tell Overture plays music through your Apple's speaker (set your IIGS to slow speed; otherwise, you'll be playing it *much* too fast). While the theme is being played, dots on the screen provide an animated display.

The other programs we liked were all in the educational category. Africa is a tutorial/quiz program that teaches you background information about the dark continent. Motion Simulator is an excellent real-time physics simulator program that shows a user how motion and acceleration are related. And Longevity lets a user calculate life expectancy.

Another program we really liked was Ecology. The user is given a variety of species for which an environment must be chosen. The object is to keep the population steady without letting predators, overpopulation or starvation take over. Ecology is a serious issue shown in a form that makes the subject interesting.

On the other hand, there are many programs in the collection that aren't worth storing on the CD ROM or a diskette. For example, the art collection programs just create simple patterns on the graphics screen. Most of the graphics packages aren't worth looking at; and a Christmas-card program just draws a tree, adds decorative ornaments and

has an elf walk in and toss a decoration on the tree. You might want to look at these programs once, but certainly not more than once.

Public Domain Software On File is a good first attempt for a method of distributing CD ROM software. The CD ROM format is excellent for distributing large amounts of data to a large number of users. However, this particular CD needs several improvements before it can become practical, including programs — lots of programs, considering the storage capacity — that use the more sophisticated capabilities of the Apple IIGS.

We think the CD ROM should include at least 32 MB of useful data, which is six times more than the current release.

WordPerfect, the powerful word processor that has become a clear favorite in the MS-DOS world and is also popular on the Mac, is now available for the Apple IIGS. Because WordPerfect is a text-based program, it does not support graphics or many special effects. Instead, it provides an impressive array of features that makes it an excellent choice for serious word processing applications.

The WordPerfect screen is, for the most part, a familiar window that displays a menu bar and other Macintosh-like features IIGS

users have come to expect. The only significant addition is the status line at the bottom of the screen. This line gives the number of the document, the page number, line number and the horizontal position of the cursor at any given moment.

Some of WordPerfect's features are clearly rooted in MS-DOS. While typical Apple programs refer to type styles by point sizes and font names, WordPerfect refers to fonts by number and pitch. Its documentation indicates that the program supports up to eight font styles, but we had to create and print a style sheet to see what the fonts looked like. We found that the differences between the fonts are relatively minor; specialized styles such as italics and script are not available.

Because many of the familiar Apple features don't work in WordPerfect exactly as they do in other IIGS programs, making the transition to the WordPerfect method can be frustrating. Take the process of selecting text with the mouse, which is called "blocking" in WordPerfect. In most IIGS programs, a word may be selected by double-clicking on it. Not so in WordPerfect. Once selected, text may usually be deleted by typing over it. That doesn't work in WordPerfect either; you have to delete blocked text before typing over it.

One difference between WordPerfect and the usual Apple functions turns out to be a convenience. In most Apple programs, the scroll bar changes what is displayed on screen, but not the position of the cursor. In WordPerfect, moving the scroll box moves the cursor, too. If you want to move the cursor to the beginning of a document, all you have to do is move the scroll box to the top of the scroll bar.

Given these discrepancies, it is fortunate that WordPerfect comes with excellent documentation. The program's extensive user's guide includes a 22-lesson tutorial. The lessons, which cover most program aspects, are well-designed and very helpful. Additionally, a reference section covers all of the program's remaining commands and functions. WordPerfect also offers an online help capability that makes learning the program even easier.

While pull-down menus and mouse-based commands are easy to use, they do slow you down. WordPerfect provides both ease of use and speed by allowing three methods of entering commands: the mouse, the menu bar and keyboard equivalents, which are the fastest way to execute a command.

Because of the special features available to automate time-consuming tasks, WordPerfect is a good choice for serious word processing jobs. Footnotes and end notes, for example — which can be real headaches to place correctly in text — are automatically handled by the program.

Defining and using macros can automate just about any repetitive program task. WordPerfect's macro function is powerful enough to allow chaining and conditional macros. Chaining lets you place a macro within another macro to carry out several consecutive tasks. Conditional macros allow you to set a condition and have the macro perform one task if the condition is met and another task if the condition is not met.

WordPerfect also offers an extensive merging function that can be used to take data from a secondary file and place it at a specified point in a letter or memo. Merging is the process used to automatically put addresses and salutations on form letters. WordPerfect's Merge function includes the ability to enter personalized text from the keyboard at specified points.

As all word processors, WordPerfect uses codes to communicate with a printer. Such codes include tabs, carriage returns, font specifications and other formatting information. While these codes don't normally appear on screen, it is possible to display them by selecting the Show/Hide Codes command. This is useful if you want to make sure that you entered a particular code.

Along with the standard Search and Replace functions provided by most word processors, WordPerfect allows you to search for formatting codes as well as words. You can search for particular words and, for example, all words entered in boldface.

WordPerfect provides three dictionary-based functions: a speller, a thesaurus and automatic hyphenation.

The WordPerfect spell checker, based on a 115,000-word dictionary, looks for spelling errors and such errors as double words (and and). It also has the ability to find a word list that fits a particular pattern. Suppose you aren't sure how to spell ability. Is there one "I" or two? Is it "ity" or "aty"? You can select the speller, click on Look Up and enter the word pattern you want to find, perhaps "abi=ty." The screen will — in seconds — display all the words in the program's dictionary that fit that pattern.

The WordPerfect thesaurus can help you locate both synonyms and antonyms. The thesaurus uses a three-column display that allows you to have three related references on screen at a time.

WordPerfect's greatest strength is that it provides a myriad of shortcuts to make typing and managing documents efficient. The program offers a large number of specific commands. Among these are Move Page, Move Paragraph, Move Sentence, Delete Word, Delete End Of Line and Delete End Of Page. That's just a sample; the entire list is too long to print here.

Another timesaving feature is the ability to perform certain operations directly from a disk without having to load a document. If you need to find documents in which you referred to a specific event, you can use the name of the event as the search pattern. WordPerfect finds all of the files that contain the name, saving you the time it would take to load and examine each file. WordPerfect will also print a file directly from a disk without having to load the file into memory.

There are some features that WordPerfect does not have, however. It does not support the Apple Extended Keyboard. And though an Undo function is included in the Edit menu, it was included to accommodate New Desk Accessories and has no current function in WordPerfect. The program also does not provide columnar formatting with text flow between columns.

All in all, we consider WordPerfect an excellent product. It is a particularly good choice for high school or college students who must produce papers with footnotes and end notes. In fact, WordPerfect is worthy of consideration by anyone who does serious word processing. Users who take the time to learn its extensive set of commands will be well rewarded. ■
