

## Notes on Transcription

This document is a transcription of the dialogue for 3 in Three by Cliff Johnson, still one of the best puzzle games that I've ever played. It aims to capture all the text spoken by the various characters in the game, but just the dialogue, not any of the puzzle text.


Appropriately enough, there are three versions of 3 in Three out there:

- version 1.0, copyright 1990, published by Cinemaware
- version 1.1, which contained some bug fixes
- version 1.2, copyright 1990, 1991, published by Inline Design. This is the version that is available on Cliff Johnson's web site.


There are a few differences between the 1.0 and 1.2 text, which are marked with [v1.0] or [v1.2] below. I don't have a copy of v1.1 so I haven't gone through the text there, but I have seen at least one YouTube walkthrough which has a still different line for the F's line at the end of Birds of a Feather. Version 1.2 also adds some other new features, such as the ability to replay completed puzzles, but that doesn't affect the dialogue.

I wanted to transcribe each character in its own font, but as I'm not writing this on a 1991 Mac, it's a little difficult. So instead, here's a key:


- The 3, as well as most other characters, talks in New York.
- The office workers talk in Chicago. Text on monitors and in captions is also in Chicago. Also, everyone in For Letter or Worse and Account For Yourself (including the 3, when she's there) talks in Chicago.
- The  $\pi$  (except for his first appearance in the Temple of Rhyme nor Reason), the other numbers in Inside Track, and the misfit characters talk in green-on-black Chicago. (In the Finale, the  $\pi$ 's speech bubbles are black on green instead.)
- The eyes (except when talking to each other, and when talking to the 3 at the end), the probe, and the monitors in Character Recognition talk in a green-on-black machine font, which I believe was called Mos Eisley.



I am **obviously** the number 3.



**Hey, leave us outta it!**



**All those who do not believe must be purged.**



**PROBLEM? I SOLVE PROBLEMS.**

In most levels, you can choose "the 3's words of wisdom" from the menu with the level name, press ⌘-3, or click on the 3 to receive an additional message. (In some cases, you can click on other elements or press ⌘-3 repeatedly to get more messages.) These are also included in the dialogue below.

## **Level Order**

The levels here are listed in the order they appear in the game menus (except for the Finale, which is last). You can also use the PDF bookmarks to navigate directly to a given level.

The order in which you play the levels can vary, since you have some freedom to choose. After watching the Prologue, you arrive at The Lift, and can continue there or pick any of the other levels in the first column. Each starting level unlocks a sequence of other levels, as follows:

- For Letter or Worse → The Letter Legislature
- No Business Doing [\*\*] → On Speaking Terms → Beg the Question → No Business Doing [\*\*]
- Account for Yourself [\*] → Learn your ABCs → Account for Yourself
- Meltdown [+] → Dove Owls → Show Your Colors → Take your Pick → Roaming Numerals → Pick up the Pieces → Half a Mind → Why Pick on Me → A Sole Soul → Pick a Fight → Whale of a Time → Pick on You → B's in her Bonnet → Pick up the Tab → Birds of a Feather
- Outside In → Race Ahead → Half Hearted → Third Degree
- Safety in Numbers [+] → Trust in Us → The Mesh → Another Mesh → Yet Another Mesh → Meshed Up → Mesh About → Mesh Around → What a Mesh
- Level Two [\*] → Crash of the Symbols → Level Two
- Level Four [\*] → By Virtue Of → Level Four
- Level Eight [\*] → Foreign Objects → Level Eight
- Mind's Eye [\*] → Central Processing Unit → Character Recognition → Hang in There → Mind Your P's and Q's → Mind's Eye
- The Lift → Half a Notion → Lift Off → Fall from Grace → Lift Up → Actions Speak Louder → Lift a Finger → This, That, and the Other → Lift and Separate

The levels denoted by [\*] are only a cutscene the first time you visit them, and then you return to them at the end of that level sequence to do the actual puzzle. The levels denoted by [+] are slightly different; they are also only a cutscene upon the first visit, but you can revisit them any time after the first visit to do the actual puzzle. Finally, No Business Doing, denoted by the [\*\*], is only a cutscene each of the first three visits; it's not until you finally complete Inside Track that you reach the puzzle in this level. Reaching Inside Track also unlocks new content in some of the previous puzzles, shown by a dash in the menu.

The Letter Legislature requires that all of the other puzzles in the list above be completed before you can attack its puzzle. Once you reach that goal, then you can do the last set of levels:

The Letter Legislature → No Business Doing [\*\*] → Temple of Rhyme nor Reason → Inside Track → No Business Doing → Finders Keepers → Finale

And now, the actual transcription!

Second word: Not ever!!!

Third word: Hard to say...

3 [thinking]: Such indecision!

[end]

3: So, I don't suppose any of you know the way back to the spreadsheet?

First word: Of course we do!

Second word: We do not!!!

Third word: We're not really sure.

3 [thinking]: > sigh <

## Meshed Up

3: My, my, what a surprise.

[3's words of wisdom]

3: Yep, that's it.

3: Aligned and ready to go.

3: That is, *I'm* ready to go.

3: Hmmpf, stuff and nonsense!

3: Why bother making words that sound alike, but are spelled differently?

screen: ONE - WON

3: The one won what?

screen: TWO - TOO

3: The two won too?

screen: EIGHT - ATE

3: And the eight ate what the one won and the two, too?

3: Egads, I'm beginning to sound like one of them.

3: I'd better watch that.

3: No one likes an irrational number.

### Pick a Fight

3: I hope this O appreciates what I'm doing.

[3's words of wisdom]

3: ***And stop fidgeting!!!***

[end]

O: You ungrateful wretch!

3: I beg your pardon???

O: Who do you think has to pose as a zero whenever you numbers come up short, eh?

3: You I suppose...

O: Not a U! An O!!!

3: Well that's what I meant.

O: Listen Ms. Too-Busy-To-Be-Bothered, if you can't see your way fit to lend a hand in a time of general crisis, maybe next time someone types the letter O instead of a zero, we'll rig the keyboard so it only types 3's and it'll be you that goes off-line while they scrub down your dirty bits!!!

3: Zeros, at least, know their place.

### By Virtue Of

3: I doubt this is correct.

3: I also doubt fixing it will do **me** any good.

3: On the other hand, it won't do me any harm either.

3: After all, virtue **is** its own reward.

3 [thinking]: ...yeah, right...

3: And of course, I'm still here.

3: No effect, no change, *no help at all!!!*

Top word: Unbeliever!
