

Special Instructions for Installing and Using The American Heritage Dictionary with System 7.0

If you are using The American Heritage Dictionary under Apple System 7.0 you will want to know the following:

1. Installation:
 - A. Follow Steps 1 through 6 as listed in the Installation section in Chapter 1.
 - B. Click "OK" for the message:

"Some of these items need to be stored in special places inside the System Folder in order to be available on the Mackintosh. Put them where they belong?"
 - C. Click "OK" for the message:

"1 disk accessory was put into the Apple Menu Items folder.
9 items were put into the System Folder."
 - D. AHED will now appear on your Apple Menu. It is now safe to delete the empty "Dictionary" folder and remove the last diskette.
2. 32-bit Memory Addressing (Mac LC, IIci, IIci and IIfx ONLY)

This release of The American Heritage Dictionary is compatible with most System 7.0 features. It is not, however, reliable when using the 32-bit memory addressing feature. To use AHED with System 7.0 turn 32-bit addressing off as follows:

- A. Select Control Panels from the Apple Menu.
- B. Double-click on the "Memory" icon.
- C. Click on the "Off" button for 32-bit addressing.
- D. Close the Memory window.
- E. Close the Control Panels window.

3. Launching The American Heritage Dictionary:

You can now follow the instructions in Chapter 1 on "Launching the Dictionary."

A System 7.0 Friendly upgrade to The American Heritage Dictionary is currently planned for release late this year. Be sure to register your AHED for Mac product so that you will receive update information.
