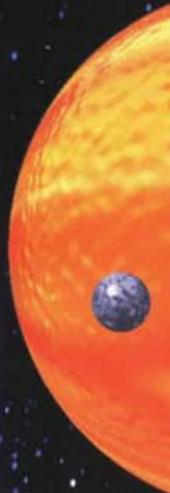

Journey to the Planets

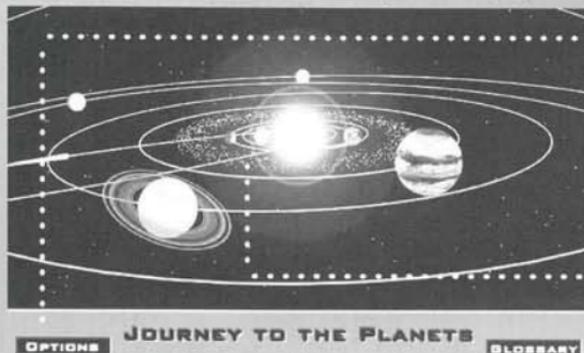


How to install and run Journey to the Planets:

1. Turn on your computer and start Windows.
Ensure that your CD-ROM drive is turned on if it is an external model. Place the disc in the CD caddy, if your drive requires it, and insert the disc into the drive.
2. From Program Manager, access File Manager.
Click on the letter representing your CD-ROM drive--we'll use 'd' for this discussion.
3. Find the install.exe file in the d: drive and double-click on it.
4. Answer all installation questions that appear on the screen, and the program will create an icon for the title once the installation is complete.
Exit Windows and re-boot your computer before running this program.
5. Afterwards, simply double-click on the Planets icon to run the program.
- 6.*For the Macintosh, place the "Journey to the Planets" disc in the CD caddy, if your drive requires it, and insert the disc into the drive.
7. Then double-click on the "Read Me First" icon, and follow the installation instructions.

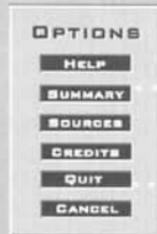
Main Menu
