PAPARAZZI! FOR WINDOWS®

Minimum System Requirements

- IBM PC or 100% compatible
- 486DX-33 MHz
- 8 MB RAM
- Double-speed CD-ROM drive (300K/sec transfer rate)
- Hard disk drive with 22 MB available
- 256 color SVGA (640 x 480)
- MS-DOS or PC-DOS 6.0
- Microsoft® Windows 3.1 (Windows 95 compatible; NT not supported)
- Mouse
- 100% Windows compatible sound card

Installation

Windows 3.1

1. Insert DISC ONE into your CD-ROM drive. (We will assume this is your D drive.)
2. In Windows, drag down the FILE menu and select RUN. Then click the BROWSE button. Under the DRIVES section, go to drive D: or the drive letter which represents your CD-ROM drive. Double-click on SETUP.EXE and click the OK button in the RUN dialog box. Now follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.
3. When installation of Paparazzi! is complete, you must install **QuickTime™ 2.0.1.41 for Windows** if you have an older version. Open

the folder QTW on your CD-ROM drive (which you chose in step 2). Double-click on SETUP.EXE and click the OK button in the RUN dialog box. Select LOCAL and click on CONTINUE. This installer will automatically install QuickTime™ and ask if you want to erase obsolete versions of QuickTime™. If you do have an older version, click REMOVE to erase it. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.

Windows 95

1. Insert DISC ONE into your CD-ROM drive. (We will assume this is your D drive.)
2. In Windows 95, click on the START menu button and click on RUN. Then click the BROWSE button. Find and double-click on the drive letter which represents your CD-ROM drive. Double-click on the SETUP program and click the OK button in the RUN dialog box. Now follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.
3. When installation of Paparazzi! is complete, you must install **QuickTime™ 2.0.1.41 for Windows** if you have an older version. To do this, click on the START menu button and then click on RUN. Now click the BROWSE button. Find and double-click on the drive letter which represents your CD-ROM drive. Open the folder QTW by double-clicking on it. Then double-click on the SETUP program and click OK in the RUN dialog box. Select LOCAL and click CONTINUE. Now follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.

Check out the READ ME file in the Museworthy program group for more performance and installation tips.

Starting Your Adventure in Tinseltown!

In Windows 3.1, look for the Museworthy program group on your desktop. Double-click to open it. Inside you'll find the PAPARAZZI! icon and the READ ME file. Double-click PAPARAZZI! and you're on your way!

In Windows 95, click the Start button, point to Programs, point to the Museworthy folder, then click on Paparazzi! to run the game. Now, you're on your way!

DO NOT launch the game off of your CD-ROM drive.

Tips for Running in Windows

If you suffer video performance lags, check your Windows manual for instructions on optimizing memory for CD-ROM playback. Each system is a little different, so please check the manuals that came with your computer before tearing apart your system. Be sure to save a copy of your original startup files. Keep in mind that most of these tips are geared for Windows 3.1 users.

Beyond that, here are some other things you can try:

1. Make sure no other programs are running.
2. In the SETTINGS... menu of the Windows Program Manager, turn "Minimize On Use" ON.
3. Disable any extraneous sounds you may have added to Windows. They take up RAM.
4. Disable any extra fonts you don't need.

5. Use MEMMAKER from the DOS prompt and free up as much extended memory as possible. Try turning Expanded (XMS) memory OFF. The Custom Settings of MEMMAKER will also allow you to optimize upper memory for Windows.
6. Get a CD-ROM disk caching utility. These are often more effective than SPEEDRV for CD-ROMs. We used Norton Speedrive. There are other good ones available from your local computer store or software catalog.
7. In the Buffers line of CONFIG.SYS, set BUFFERS to 10 or less.
8. Go through your CONFIG.SYS and AUTOEXEC.BAT files and REM out unnecessary drivers. If you find a really good configuration for Paparazzi! that is not so good for your other applications, make a boot disk with your Paparazzi! start-up settings on it, and boot from there when you play.
9. If you want to make more room on your hard drive, but still want to continue your Paparazzi! games at a later time, save ONLY the .TXT files in \MUSE_PC to another location or a floppy, then delete the entire \MUSE_PC directory. When you want to play again, install the game like always, then copy your saved .TXT files over the ones in the new \MUSE_PC directory.
10. Paparazzi! does not support Novell DOS 7, any shareware Windows shell or third-party memory caching utilities. Our suggestion is to run a nice, clean version of DOS/Windows 3.1 or Windows 95.
11. The video in Paparazzi! is optimized for 32,000 (or so) colors. Run your video card in 16-bit resolution for the best possible movie playback quality. You can try going down to 256 colors (8-bit) playback if 16-bit doesn't work.

Troubleshooting

Problem: My QuickTime™ movies just show a line or are not appearing.

Solution: You might not have the latest driver for your video card, which it needs to support QuickTime™. Contact your video card or computer manufacturer for the latest driver for your video card. Free driver updates are usually available via most on-line services or via mail.

Problem: What about driver compatibilities?

Solution: If you have one of the new local bus video cards that uses the Tseng4000 chipset, the newest driver will work. STB's SuperPixel Driver up to version 2.3 is not compatible. Also, check the QuickTime™ for Windows READ ME for sound and video card compatibility lists. Only change your driver as a last resort, try simpler memory management techniques first.

Problem: Load time for game start-up seems long. (1.5 to 2 minutes)

Solution: Paparazzi! prefers a CD-ROM drive named "D\:". It will run on any drive letter, but it prefers D. If your CD-ROM drive letter is not D, you have either changed it, or there are other devices in your setup calling themselves "D."

If no other devices use D, here's how to change your CD-ROM drive to D:

1. Go into the AUTOEXEC.BAT startup file using EDIT.
2. Find the line that contains "MSCDEX". This is the CD-ROM driver.
3. Right at the end of the line, leave one space, then type /L:D.

Problem: A system error appeared on the screen while I was playing the game.

Solution: The first thing to do is not panic! The game automatically saves your progress (your progress is saved every time you come back from a shoot). These errors do surface from time to time because each computer is configured differently and certain conflicts do arise. Just quit out of the program and restart your computer. Restart Paparazzi! and choose the persona you were playing. You'll be back where you left off.

Please refer to the **READ ME** file in the Museworthy program group for additional troubleshooting information.

PAPARAZZI! FOR MACINTOSH

Minimum System Requirements

- 4400K of available memory (4096K for Paparazzi! and 300K for QuickTime™ overhead).
- 22 MB of available hard disk space
- A 68040 or PowerPC processor
- QuickTime™ 2.0, Apple Multimedia Tuner and QuickTime™ Musical Instruments (and QuickTime™ PowerPlug for PowerPCs). These extensions are available on Disc One.
- A double-speed CD-ROM drive (300K/sec transfer rate)
- System 7.1.2 to 7.5 supported
- 640 X 480 – 256 (8-bit) color video
- 13" color monitor

Installation

1. Insert Disc One into your CD-ROM drive.
2. Open the Disc One "PPrazzi 1" CD and select the "MUSEWTHY" folder and drag it directly onto your hard drive. (Note: never run the program directly off of the CD and do not put the "MUSEWTHY" folder inside of another. It must remain on the top level of the hard drive.)

ALWAYS leave the "MUSEWTHY" folder as is. You can move the folder around the desktop, but do not move any of the items inside of the folder as there are hidden files in the folder that the game needs to run properly.

3. **If you are installing onto a PowerPC** — open the folder "Put in PowerPC System," select and drag one item at a time into the System folder (the computer will place these files into the "Extensions" folder automatically). If you see any messages which you don't understand, see the *Troubleshooting* section.

If you are installing onto a 680x0 Mac — open the folder "Put in 680x0 System," select and drag one item at a time into the System folder (the computer will place these files into the "Extensions" folder automatically). If you see any messages which you don't understand, see the first item in the *Troubleshooting* section.

4. Restart your computer (to enable the recently installed extensions you just placed in the System folder).

Starting Your Adventure in Tinseltown!

1. Insert Disc One into your CD-ROM drive.
2. Open the "MUSEWTHY" folder on your hard drive and double-click on the Paparazzi! icon. For some clues on how to become a successful paparazzi, see the *Here's the Scenario* section. If you experience any problems with installation or while playing the game, see the *Tips for Running on the Macintosh* and *Troubleshooting* sections.

Tips for Running on the Macintosh

To get Paparazzi! to run optimally, perform these steps:

1. Set the Monitors control panel (in the Control Panels folder) to thousands of colors (16-bit). Paparazzi! is optimized for thousands of colors (16-bit), but if there are problems with the program, try switching to 256 colors (8-bit) as the program will run fine in this mode as well (the video will not be as detailed).
2. Turn off file sharing. This is accomplished by going into the Control Panels folder (located in the System folder) and double-clicking on Sharing Setup. Under the File Sharing section, make sure File Sharing is OFF. If it is not off, hit the Stop button to turn it off.
3. Turn off AppleTalk. This is accomplished by going into the Chooser (located in the Apple Menu) and hitting the Inactive button in the AppleTalk section.

4. In the Memory control panel, make sure Virtual Memory is OFF, Modern Memory Manager is ON and 32-Bit Addressing is ON (depending on the type of computer you have, not all of these options will be available). Restart your computer so that any changes you make will take effect.
5. As stated in the Minimum System Requirements section, approximately 4400K is needed in order to run the program (4096K for Paparazzi! and 300K for QuickTime™ overhead).

If your computer has more than 4400K of available memory (total memory minus system software and other opened programs) allocate as much as you can to Paparazzi! while leaving approximately 300K for QuickTime™ overhead. Once you have determined how much more memory you can allocate, type this number in the Preferred size field in the Get Info window of the Paparazzi! program icon. This is accomplished by selecting the Paparazzi! icon and getting info on it (either by choosing the option Get Info under the File menu or by hitting the Command and letter "I" keys simultaneously). Once in the Get Info window, click on the Locked square (the "X" should disappear indicating that it is okay to change the number), change the number in the Preferred size field and then lock the window by clicking on the Locked square. Close the Get Info window and now try playing Paparazzi!

6. If your computer has less than 4400K of available memory, you will need to make more memory available by performing one or more of the following steps:
 - A. Close any other programs which are currently open.

- B. Configure your system so less extensions (which use up memory) are being used by turning off any unnecessary extensions. (You need to leave ON the extensions which you put into your System folder in step 3 of the Installation section. You will also need to leave on any other extensions which will enable your CD-ROM drive to run properly.) This is accomplished by performing one of the following steps:

- If your system software is earlier than System 7.5 or doesn't have Extensions Manager — go into the "Extensions" folder and remove any unnecessary extensions by placing them in a different folder. (You may want to label this folder as "Disabled Extensions".) Restart your computer for the changes to take effect. (This will disable the extensions you just placed in the "Disabled Extensions" folder.)

Once you are done playing Paparazzi!, open the "Disabled Extensions" folder drag the extensions inside back into the "Extensions" folder, and restart your computer. Your Macintosh is back to "normal" and you are now ready to run programs other than Paparazzi!

- If you have System 7.5 — you can use Extensions Manager. This is accomplished by accessing Extensions Manager either under the Apple menu in the Control Panels section or by double-clicking on Extensions Manager in the Control Panels folder (which is located in the System folder). Save the current set as "Standard" set or another name of your choosing. Using the Manager, turn off any unnecessary extensions by clicking on the item (the check mark

next to the item disappears, indicating that it has been disabled). Save the set as Paparazzi!.

This will be the set that you will need to use every time you want to play Paparazzi!. To play Paparazzi! with this set, follow these steps:

- 1) Before running Paparazzi!, run Extensions Manager and load the Paparazzi! set. (You should see that only the extensions that you chose in the above step have check marks next to them. If not, perform the above step again.)
 - 2) Quit out of Extensions Manager and restart your computer. This will enable the Paparazzi! extensions set.
 - 3) Play Paparazzi!
 - 4) Once you are done playing Paparazzi!, run Extensions Manager and load the "Standard" set (or the name you chose).
 - 5) Quit out of Extensions Manager and restart your computer.
 - 6) Your system is now configured to run programs other than Paparazzi!.
- C. If, after performing all of these steps, you are still unable to obtain 4400K of available memory (RAM), try disabling all fonts and unnecessary sounds. In addition, you may try to allocate less memory for QuickTime™ overhead via the Get Info window (however, this may cause some problems to appear).

Troubleshooting

Problem: During installation, when I place the extensions in the System folder, the computer tells me that it couldn't put in "QuickTime™" because it is in use.

Solution: First, hit the Cancel button. Second, find out which version of QuickTime™ you have. Go into the Extensions folder (located in the System folder), select the QuickTime™ extension and Get Info on it (either by choosing the option Get Info under the File menu or by hitting the Command and letter "I" keys simultaneously). Do the same for the QuickTime™ extension on Disc One. If the version in your System folder is a more recent version, don't replace your QuickTime™. If it is the same version, determine which was modified more recently. (This information is in the same Get Info window.) If your version was modified more recently, you do not need to replace it. If not, you will need to replace your QuickTime™ extension with ours. This is accomplished in the following manner:

- A. Disable your current QuickTime™ extension. (Detailed instructions on disabling extensions are in step 6B in the *Tips for Running on the Macintosh* section.)
- B. Restart your computer (to disable your QuickTime™ extension).
- C. Place our QuickTime™ extension (found on Disc One) in the "Extensions" folder.
- D. Restart your computer (to enable our newer QuickTime™ extension).
- E. You may trash your older QuickTime™ extension.

Problem: During installation, I was asked if I should replace an extension that already exists.

Solution: First, hit the Cancel button. Second, find out which version of the extension you have. Go into the Extensions folder (in the System folder), select the extension and Get Info on it (either by choosing the option Get Info under the File menu or by hitting the Command and letter "I" keys simultaneously). Do the same for the extension on Disc One. If the one in your System folder is a more recent version, don't replace it. If it is the same version, determine which was modified more recently. (This information is in the same Get Info window.) If your version was modified more recently, you do not need to replace it. If not, you will need to replace your extension with ours — select the more recent extension, drag it into your Extensions folder and hit the replace button when the computer asks you if it should replace your extension.

Problem: When I try to play Paparazzi!, the computer says that there is not enough memory available.

Solution: You need to make more memory available for Paparazzi!:

- **If you are playing on a 680x0 Mac** — First, click on the OK button. Second, see step 6 in the Tips for Running on the Macintosh section.
- **If you are playing on a PowerPC** — First, click on the OK button. Second, select the Paparazzi! icon and Get Info on it (either by choosing the option Get Info under the File menu or by hitting the Command and letter "I" keys simultaneously). Once in the Get Info window, click on the Locked square (the "X" should disappear indicating that it is

okay to change the numbers), change the number in the Minimum and Preferred size fields to 4096 and then lock the window by clicking on the Locked square. Close the Get Info window and now try playing Paparazzi!. If you are still experiencing memory problems, see step 6 in the *Tips for Running on the Macintosh* section.

Problem: There is no picture when I play video clips (only audio works).

Solution: You need to leave more memory for QuickTime™ overhead. This means that you will have to reduce the amount of memory that the system needs (see step 6 in the *Tips for Running on the Macintosh* section).

Problem: A system error appeared on the screen while I was playing the game.

Solution: The first thing to do is not panic! The game automatically saves your progress (your progress is saved every time you come back from a shoot). These errors do surface from time to time because each computer is configured differently and certain conflicts do arise. Just quit out of the program and restart your computer. Restart Paparazzi! and choose the persona you were playing. You'll be back where you left off.

Problem: The video is not very detailed.

Solution: Your monitor is probably set for 256 colors (8-bit). Just go into the Monitors control panel in the Control Panels section under the Apple Menu and change your colors to thousands (16-bit).

Problem: It seems as if my particular shot is not being taken when I press the button.

Solution: Not to worry, the shot that is in the camera when you press the button, not when you hear the shutter click, is the one that is developed in the darkroom.

Problem: I need space on my hard drive, but I don't want to get rid of Paparazzi!

Solution: Paparazzi! automatically saves your progress. It does this by making changes to the player text files which are located in the "MUSEWTHY" folder (they are named APLAYERx.TXT). These files (there are six of them; one for each player) are the only ones which you need to save. Place these in a different folder or on a floppy diskette. Now you can throw away your "MUSEWTHY" folder. When you install MUSEWTHY back on your hard drive (by following the instructions in the Installation section), select and drag your saved APLAYERx.TXT files into the "MUSEWTHY" folder. When the computer asks you if you should replace the ones already in the folder, hit the Replace button. You are ready to play Paparazzi! where you left off.

Problem: When I'm at the point in the game when I need to switch Discs, the CD will not eject when the game asks me to switch.

Solution: Your computer and its peripherals (CD-ROM drives, DAT drives, etc.) are being shared. You need to turn File Sharing OFF. This is accomplished by quitting out of Paparazzi! (your progress will be saved automatically), going into the Control Panels folder (located in the System folder)

and double-clicking on Sharing Setup. Under the File Sharing section, make sure File Sharing is OFF. If File Sharing is not OFF, hit the Stop button to turn it off. Play Paparazzi! — you'll be back where you left off.

Problem: It seems as if my video and audio are not synchronized.

Solution: There are several remedies:

- First, be sure your System software version is at least 7.1.2 (we have experienced some problems with lower versions).
- Second, make sure your computer is optimized for Paparazzi! Perform steps 1 thru 4 in the *Tips for Running on the Macintosh* section. Try playing Paparazzi!
- Third, if you are still experiencing these problems, perform step 6 in the *Tips for Running on the Macintosh* section.



WHERE TO GO?

If you want to meet the stars, all you have to do is put yourself in their shoes. It's not as hard as you think! Remember, even though they're stars, they still go shopping, eat out and frequent bars just like you and me. Here are a few places you can rub elbows with the rich and famous:
