

Read Me First

Special Note for Duxbury Braille Translator / Macintosh Users Document Number ds-albj1-m77, July 7, 1992

Since the last printing of The Duxbury Braille Translator Overview (ds-ajl93-lan) there has been a change made to the Translator which may affect the installation procedure for some users.

There is a new file on the distribution disk, named "Braille." This file contains a TrueType font for displaying and printing simulated braille. System 7.0 users may wish to use the TrueType font in place of the bitmapped fonts contained in the font suitcase "Braille Font." To do this, simply copy "Braille" to your System folder instead of copying "Braille Font" to the same place.

Since TrueType fonts are not supported by Macintosh System software versions prior to 7.0, users of System 6.0.x and earlier should simply ignore the new "Braille" file and proceed to install as directed in the Overview.

X **If you have purchased both the Translator and the Duxbury Braille Font for Adobe Type Manager, *do not* install either the bitmapped or TrueType fonts included with the Translator. Instead, install *only* the fonts from the Braille Font distribution disk, following the instructions that come with that product.**
