





Tool Icons: Click Theme to choose an appearance theme for World Book, click Sticky Note to add a new sticky note, and use Highlighter to highlight parts of the text.

Area Icons: Use these icons to go to the Article, Media Center, Atlas, Just Looking, Time Frame, Surf the Ages, and What's Online areas.


Media Canister: Displays the media available in articles, multiview illustrations, and maps.

World Book Tool Kit



There are four icons on the left side of the World Book screen which you can click to open the four most often used toolsets. Click any of the four icons to hide or show the Tool Kit area.

Format Document: Notepad includes number of options, such as inserting headers and footers, page breaks, and page numbering, that allow you to create professional-looking documents.



Change Fonts. Click this icon to select any font available on your computer from the WYSIWYG fonts list.



View Statistics. Click this icon to count the number of pages, words, characters, paragraphs, and lines in your document.

Tip: As you move your pointer over the Navigation map, you will see the location's latitude and longitude displayed in the Location field. This helps you find an exact location on the map. Click when you find the place you want.

A Foucault pendulum shows the rotation of the earth. It swings back and forth in the same plane, but the earth's rotation makes the pendulum appear to change its path gradually.




