

## GETTING STARTED

### Installation Instructions

#### MPC for Windows® version:

1. Insert the CD into the CD-ROM drive (in a caddy if necessary).
2. In the Windows Program Manager, choose Run from the File menu.
3. In the Command Line box, type **D:\setup** (where **D** is the letter of your CD drive).
4. Click OK, and then follow the directions.

**System Requirements for MPC for Windows®:** Requires 486SX/25 or above running Windows 3.1 or later; 8 MB of RAM; 6 MB hard drive space available; double-speed CD-ROM drive; 256 color SuperVGA monitor; SoundBlaster® or compatible sound card with Windows drivers.

#### Macintosh® version:

1. Insert the CD into the CD-ROM drive.
2. To start, double-click on the **Drivin' Route 66** icon.

**System Requirements for Macintosh®:** Requires a 68030 processor or above running System Software 7.0 or later; 8 MB of RAM; double-speed CD-ROM drive; 256 color monitor.






## Drivin' Route 66 Main Screen
