Utilities: All the software you need to use this CD-ROM including Roger Wagner Publishing's HyperStudio Player, Microsoft PowerPoint Viewer, and Adobe Acrobat Reader. (See installation directions on back of this folder.)

For Windows 3.x Users

1. Put the FETC CD-ROM in the CD-ROM drive.
2. Start Windows.
3. In the Program Manager window, click on File and then click on Run.
4. In the Command Line box, type the drive letter for the CD-ROM drive (often this is the D drive), followed by a colon, backslash, and the phrase install\setup. For example, type:
d:\install\setup
(Setup copies files from the CD-ROM to an FETC96 subdirectory on your hard drive and creates a group called FETC96 on your Windows desktop.)
5. Click on OK.
6. At the Destination Directory screen, just click on OK.
7. Click on Intro in the FETC96 group from the Windows desktop to begin the introductory program and to

complete the installation procedure. Once you have completed this program, you will be able to use the Windows File Manager (from Main) to explore the files on the CD-ROM.

For Macintosh Users

1. Put the FETC CD-ROM in the CD-ROM drive.
2. Double-click on the Start Here icon.
3. Double-click on the Introduction & Installer icon.
4. Once you have completed this program you will be able to explore all the folders on the CD-ROM by clicking on the section icons.
