





Getting Started

To run *Let's Talk About ME! Too*, you must install it to your hard drive. Follow the installation instructions below for your particular system.

Macintosh® Installation

- * Place the *Let's Talk About ME! Too* CD into your CD-ROM drive. A window will pop open.
- * Double-click the **Install Let's Talk About ME! Too** icon. If you have already installed the original *Let's Talk About ME!*, the installer will put this program in the same folder. If you have not installed the

original *Let's Talk About ME!*, the Installer will create a folder called "Let's Talk About Me!" and install this program into it.

- * To run *Let's Talk About ME! Too*, make sure you have the CD in the CD-ROM drive. Open the *Let's Talk About ME!* folder on your hard drive and double-click the **Let's Talk About ME! Too** icon.

Windows® 95 Installation

- * Place the *Let's Talk About ME! Too* CD into your CD-ROM drive.
- * Double-click the **My Computer** icon on your desktop. Double-click the CD-ROM icon titled **About_ME2**.
- * Double-click the **setup.exe** icon and follow the on-screen prompts.
- * If you have installed the original *Let's Talk About ME!*, the installer will find the correct directory and install *Let's Talk About ME! Too* in the same place.
- * After installation, if you have a modem and wish to register your copy of *Let's Talk About ME! Too*, click the **Yes** button and follow the on-screen prompts. Windows® 3.x Installation

My Hairmaster Deluxe



Hairmaster Deluxe lets you create some terrific hair-do's—and don'ts.

- ✿ Click on the left or right side of the different diamonds to scroll through a variety of faces, styles, and colors.
- ✿ Some choices have alternate views if you click on the smaller mirror.
- ✿ Go to the Salon-a-tron to import a photograph of yourself or of a friend—that way you can try out the styles and colors of My Hairmaster Deluxe.

- ✿ The My Stuff diamond lets you load in a picture you've imported. Hey—maybe you'll find a style that looks so good you'll want a makeover!
- ✿ To change or stop the music, click on the musical note.

The Salon-a-tron

Ever wonder what YOU would look like with a purple bouffant? Or your friend or cousin? Now you can find out. The Salon-a-tron is a nifty tool that lets you import and manipulate your own pictures so you can save them to use in My Hairmaster Deluxe.

Get Digital

If you need to get your pictures digitized so that you can use them in Hairmaster Deluxe, choose **Order digital versions of your pictures**. Use this order form to send away film, pictures, or slides you want digitized. Your pictures will come back on a 3.5" floppy disk so you can import them and get started.

Once you've scanned your pictures or have them on a floppy disk, you need to import and edit your pictures to use them in My Hairmaster Deluxe. Your digital pictures should be in a PICT or BMP file format.

First, add your digital pictures to your files.

- ✿ Find and open the directory where you've installed *Let's Talk About ME! Too*.
- ✿ You should see a folder there with your name on it. Open it, and then open the folder labeled **hairstuf**.
- ✿ Finally, open the folder labeled **toTrim** and drag the pictures from wherever you keep them into the **toTrim** folder. When you go back and start *Let's Talk About ME! Too*, you should see your picture files listed in the Salon-a-tron when it's time to choose a picture to edit.

Now, customize your digital pictures.

- ✿ Select a picture from the list of files and click its name.
- ✿ Click **preview it** to view your selection.
- ✿ Click on **choose it** if that's the pic you want to edit. The pics must be edited to fit the hairstyles and also to remove all the extra background stuff.
- ✿ Click and drag the picture to center the image.
- ✿ Size your picture as needed. Use the + or – button to enlarge or shrink the image. Click **continue** when you're done.
- ✿ Now you're ready to trim away all the background stuff and isolate

your face and neck. Click on the different block shapes to select different cutting tools.

- ✿ If you make a mistake, click **Undo it** to undo your last cut. If you think you've made lots of mistakes click **Refresh it** to start over.
- ✿ Click **Check it** if you like what you've been doing and want to try out your work in some wigs.

Decide whether you want to save or trash your picture, or start over. You can use your picture as soon as you save it! Try on a variety of styles and colors. Next time, just click on the My Stuff diamond in Hair-master Deluxe to load all of your saved pictures!

You can take your own great pics for My Hairmaster Deluxe.

It's really easy and fun to do!


- ✿ Try to find a plain background to shoot the picture against so you stand out.
- ✿ Remember it's your *face* that's really the most important in the picture. Pull your hair back and off your face and neck, if possible. You'll have an easier time trimming around your face if you keep your hair out of the way.



- ✿ Sit "knee-to-knee" with the person taking your picture to find a good distance to frame your face.
- ✿ Try out different looks—smiling, serious, distinguished, impish. Add your favorite necklace, or try a V-neck or crew neck. Solid, especially darker, colors look best when digitized.



My Zodiac Zone




Check out what the stars have to say about your fashion sense!

My Diary


This diary is just like your real diary except it's really easy to add pictures and colored text.



All diary entries written using the original *Let's Talk About ME!* or *Let's Talk About ME! Too* are available and able to be used in either program.

❁ To write in your diary, click the pencil and begin typing. To change the color of the text, click the three color circles until you get a color you like. Save what you've been writing at any time by clicking **Save**. Click **Print** to print out your entry. **Note:** Only your text will print.

- ✿ To add pictures to your diary, click the **Get Stuff** button. To get rid of stuff, click the **trash can**, then click whatever you want to remove. To move your pictures, click the grabber hand, then click and drag stuff to wherever you want.
- ✿ To change the background pattern on the diary, click on it until you see one you like.
- ✿ If you need to keep your writing private, you can click the **Panic!** button to make your writing temporarily disappear. Click the **Panic!** button again to restore the screen.
- ✿ To leave yourself a note for later—or if you just want to read something you wrote a long time ago, click on the **Dates** button. Use the arrows to scroll to the year and month you're looking for, then click on a date.

Note: Remember, to change or stop the music, you can click on the musical note.

How to put your own pictures into *Get Stuff* for your diary:

Get Stuff can use pictures in PICT or Bitmap formats.

On a PC:

- ✿ Put the floppy disk with your pictures on it into the floppy drive.
- ✿ Go to the place where *Let's Talk About ME! Too* is installed. Find and open the folder named **About Me**. If you are running Windows 95, you'll find this folder inside the Program Files folder on drive C. If you are running Windows 3.1, About Me should be listed right on drive C, so use the File Manager to open it.
- ✿ Once you open this folder, you should see a directory with your username (the name you used when you signed in to the program) OR a directory with the first part of your name and two numbers (if you are using Windows 3.1 and your name is longer than eight characters). Open this folder.
- ✿ In this directory is a folder called **pics**. Copy the files from the floppy disk into the **pics** folder.

On a Macintosh:

- ✿ Put the floppy disk containing your pictures into the floppy drive.
- ✿ On your desktop or hard drive, find and open the folder called *Let's Talk About ME! Too*.

- * Now find and open the folder with your username (the name you used when you signed in to *Let's Talk About ME! Too*).
- * Look for the folder called **pics**. Copy the files from the floppy disk into the **pics** folder.

NOTE FOR ALL PLATFORMS: Each picture that you add must be in two formats: large and small. The large size picture should be 100x100 pixels, and the name should start with an L (for example, **Lmydog.pic**). The small (thumbnail) size picture should be 50x50 pixels and the name should start with a T (for example, **Tmydog.pic**).

If there is a filename conflict with any pictures that are already in the **pics** folder, you should rename one of the two sets. Make sure that you have an L file and a T file for each of your pictures. After you have copied the files, you should be able to see them when you use the **Get Stuff** button and select **My Pictures**.

Before You Call Technical Support

If possible, please be at your computer and have it on when you call. We can assist you most effectively if you have the following information ready.

Windows

1. The *product name* and *version number* of the product.
2. The type of *processor* and *clock speed* (e.g., 486/66) of your computer.
3. Your operating system's *version number* (e.g., Windows 95) and the amount of *free memory* and *system resources* you have available. For Windows 3.1, go to the Program Manager and select About Program Manager from the Help menu; for Windows 95 and later, choose the My Computer icon, then choose About Windows 95 (or later) from the Help Menu. The Windows version number and the memory and system resources values will appear in the dialog box.
4. The brand name of the *sound device* and *video card* in your computer.
5. The complete and exact *error message* reported by the program (if any).
6. A printout of your *config.sys* and *autoexec.bat* files.

Macintosh

1. The *product name*.
2. The *model name* of your Mac.
3. The *system version number* and *memory*. On the Apple menu, select About This Macintosh (or About This Computer in System 7.6). In the dialog box that appears, the system version number will be at the upper right and the memory at the lower left.
