


# Optimizing Performance

Prime Target should perform well on any PowerMacintosh. If Prime Target seems sluggish or "choppy," we suggest you try these tips:

(Note: These tips work only on Macintosh computers with more than 8MB of built-in memory. Please see the other side of this insert if you have only 8MB of built-in memory.)

## 1. Turn Virtual Memory OFF.

- From the Apple menu, select Control Panels. Then, choose Memory. Make sure Virtual Memory is OFF.



- Close the Memory control panel by clicking on the box in the upper left corner.

2. Drag your Prime Target Preferences file to the trash can if you played a "Demo" version of Prime Target. The Prime Target Preferences file is located in the Preferences folder inside your System folder.

3. Turn RAM Doubler OFF. (Refer to your RamDoubler Manual)

4. Turn off un-necessary extensions: (for users with System 7.5 only)

- From the Apple menu, select Control Panels. Then, choose Extensions Manager.

b. Select "All Off."

c. Turn on the following extensions by clicking so that a check appears next to them: QuickTime, QuickTime PowerPlug, Sound Manager, and Apple CD-ROM.

d. Close the Extensions Manager by clicking on the box in the upper left corner.

e. Restart your Macintosh.

**Within Prime Target** (if necessary):

1. Shrink the size of your graphics window in the Prime Target Preferences.

2. Turn off the extra sounds in the Prime Target Preferences:


- Turn off Ambient Sounds
- Turn off Extra Sounds
- Turn off Stereo

# For 8 MB Computers

If you are using a PowerMacintosh with only 8MB of built-in memory, Prime Target may not work properly unless you follow these steps:

1. Turn on Virtual Memory:

a. From the Apple menu, select Control Panels. Then, choose Memory. Make sure Virtual Memory is ON. Then, set the "After Restart" memory to 10M as shown below. (If your system software version is 7.5.3 or higher, change the number to 14M.)



b. Close the Memory control panel by clicking on the box in the upper left corner.

2. Turn off all un-necessary extensions: (*for users with System 7.5 only*)

a. From the Apple menu, select Control Panels. Then, choose Extensions Manager.

b. Select "All Off."

c. Turn on the following extensions by clicking so that a check appears next to them.

- Apple CD-ROM
- QuickTime™
- QuickTime™ PowerPlug
- Sound Manager

d. Close the Extensions Manager by clicking on the box in the upper left corner.

e. Restart your Macintosh.

3. Turn off un-necessary sounds in the Prime Target Preferences:

- Turn off Ambient Sounds
- Turn off Extra Sounds
- Turn off Stereo

While following these steps will immediately improve Prime Target's performance, MacSoft will also release a free update to the program by December 1, 1996 that will greatly improve performance on 8MB machines.
