# Seven Days in August

## The Wall

*The Wall* is an eight-part documentary which chronicles events before, during and after the construction of the Berlin Wall. Rare documentary photos capture the traumatic division of Berlin, the desperate flight of refugees and the rising tension between the superpowers. From Kennedy to Khrushchev, from Washington to Moscow, *The Wall* is a day-by-day, eye-witness account of the people and events that shook the world in 1961.

## Roundtable

An insightful and provocative roundtable discussion features the firsthand recollections of men who played pivotal roles in the Berlin Wall crisis. Host Walter Isaacson and guests McGeorge Bundy, Egon Bahr, Valentin Berezhev, Daniel Schorr and Strobe Talbott reveal an inside view of events as they happened in Washington, Moscow and Berlin. *Roundtable* offers a unique perspective on the superpower confrontation as seen from both sides of the Iron Curtain. The final comments of the panel cover the triumphant day in 1989 when the Wall came down.

## Home Front

America's passion for baseball and rock & roll was undiminished during the Cold War, but the sixties were also a time of emerging political movements. A wealth of archival photos documents the race to the moon, backyard fallout shelters, the birth of the Peace Corps and the struggle for civil rights.

## Berliners and Berlin, Wisconsin

Explore *Berliners* and hear the dramatic personal experiences of Berliners whose lives were changed forever by the events of 1961. In contrast, people from *Berlin, Wisconsin* describe life in small-town America at the dawn of the 1960s.

## Profiles

Read *Profiles* for the biographies of the political leaders who shaped the direction of events in Berlin—people such as John F. Kennedy, Nikita Khrushchev, Erich Honecker and Willy Brandt.

## Souvenirs

*Souvenirs* is a nostalgic look back at American pop culture. From books and cars to songs and TV shows, you'll see and hear the best from the summer of '61.

## Archive

*Archive*, a treasure trove of maps and documents including recently declassified top-secret correspondence, enhances your understanding of events in Berlin.

## Games

For a lighthearted change of pace, interactive games test your skill and knowledge of the world of 1961. Try your hand as a fashion advisor to Jacqueline Kennedy in *First Lady of Fashion*. Step up to home plate with *For the Record*, a baseball trivia game.

# CD-ROM Set-up

## What You'll Need

A color Macintosh with a 13-inch monitor, 4 megabytes of memory and System 6.0.7 or later and a Macintosh-compatible CD-ROM drive.

## Playing CD-ROM Discs

For information on how to install the CD-ROM drive and play the disc, consult the manual that came with your CD-ROM drive. Remember to turn on the CD-ROM drive before you start your Macintosh.

## Starting the Program

Insert the disc into your CD-ROM player and open the icon, *7\_DAYS*, that appears on your desktop. Open the application called *7DAYS* to start the program. Inside the program, a *TOUR* is available to introduce you to the features of *Seven Days in August*.

## The CD-ROM Player

Remember to turn on your CD-ROM drive before you start your Macintosh.

This program requires current CD-ROM software. Audio problems and/or messages indicating that the Macintosh cannot read the disc indicate that your drive

software needs to be updated: contact your dealer for assistance.

If you have a non-Apple CD-ROM drive you will need an up-to-date driver designed for your machine.

If you have an AppleCD SC® CD-ROM drive, you will need *Apple CD-ROM* version 3.0 or later. If your CD-ROM drive is an AppleCD SC Plus, you will need *Apple CD-ROM* version 3.2 or later. The appropriate version should be installed in your System Folder if you are running System 6.0.7. If you are running System 7.0 or later, install the file inside the Extensions Folder in your System Folder.

To find the version, open the System Folder, select the file *Apple CD-ROM* and choose Get Info from the Finder File menu. If the version number is earlier than needed, contact your local dealer for an update.

## Color

Open the Control Panels desk accessory and set Monitors to 256 colors.

## ReadMe

On the CD-ROM is a file titled *README*. Open it from the CD-ROM to read late-breaking news concerning this program.

## Troubleshooting

**Problem** You cannot mount *7\_DAYS* or any other CD.

**Solution** In addition to checking the SCSI setup, make sure that the driver for your CD is correctly installed and working. Check your CD-ROM manual and reinstall the driver from the master disk if you are not sure that it is working.

**Problem** The Macintosh crashes when turned on if the CD-ROM drive is connected.

**Solution** Check the SCSI device setup. A system with two or more SCSI devices requires a terminator on the last device and there should be only one terminator in the external chain. This problem is also caused by assigning the same number to two devices: external SCSI devices require unique ID numbers between 1 and 6. Consult your equipment manuals for further information on SCSI setup and termination.

**Problem** You cannot see some of the screens in the program.

**Solution** Eliminate any Extensions which can interfere with the program. Extensions are stored inside the System Folder. You can disable them by removing them from the Extensions folder.

**Problem** Your screen saver interferes with the program.

**Solution** Disable the screen saver.
