

**F**irst there was the movies. Then there was television. Now there's something else. Imagine a thriller with a new twist each time you experience it. Imagine a mystery that is different with each pursuit. Imagine a dark corridor that beckons with another chance to confront, and maybe this time, defeat evil. Now turn on Terror T.R.A.X.

You will be in command, but not necessarily in control. You will be in the middle of a changing story, full of shifting fortunes, elusive characters, and risky choices. But don't think of this as simply a game to win or lose. You may find out that the best way to survive is to die first.





## How to Play

All program commands in Terror T.R.A.X. are handled through keys on your keyboard, not the mouse.

A: Type "A:" to choose option A displayed on your screen.

B: Type "B" to choose option B displayed on your screen.

If you don't make a choice, the program will make one for you.

Space Bar: Pause the program.

S: Save the program. Only the most recently saved program will be stored.

R: Restore the saved program at the beginning of the segment in which "S" was pressed.

X: Exit the program.

## Notes on Replay

### How Save and Restore operate

When you hit "Save", Terror T.R.A.X. records which

segment of the program you are in. It will not prompt you for a filename, or notify you that the save has been made as this would interrupt the flow of the program and you might miss important information.

If you hit "R," you will instantly return to the beginning of the segment in which you pressed "S." Experiment with this to get the feel of how it works.

## Strategy Hints

Save and Restore are useful, because if your operative gets killed you can hit "R" to return to an earlier point in the program and try again. Hit "S" at each point where you feel you've made progress. If your operative is terminated at the next decision point, you can return to the previous scene quickly and get another chance.

If you type "X" and leave the program, Terror T.R.A.X. will remember where you last hit "S." When you





restart the program, type "R" to immediately return to where you were.

### Using "A" and "B" to your best advantage

You have to make tough choices with the "A" and "B" buttons. If you don't hit them in time, the program will make the choice for you. If you want to debate the options, hit the SPACE BAR and you can pause to think about it.

### Replaying with "F"

If you have been through a segment before, and would like to skip forward, pressing "F" will advance you to the next story segment or decision point.

### Installing Terror T.R.A.X.

#### Startup

Close all other applications.

1. Insert the CD-ROM with the label side up into your CD-ROM drive.

2. Drag the folder named "Required Macintosh Software" on the Terror T.R.A.X. CD-ROM to your System folder.
3. If the system asks if you want to copy these files into the "Extensions" folder, click OK.
4. Restart your computer.
5. Double-click the Terror T.R.A.X. icon in the Terror T.R.A.X. CD-ROM window to begin the game.



### Achieving the Best Picture Quality (Optional)

Terror T.R.A.X. runs best when your computer is set to show thousands of colors instead of 256 colors.

For most systems:

1. Select the apple in the upper left hand corner of your screen.
2. Select 'Control Panel' from the pulldown menu.
3. Select 'Monitors' from the Control Panel menu.
4. Select the 'Colors' radio button, and choose



Thousands in the window to the right of the radio buttons.

5. Shut that window and double-click on the Terror T.R.A.X. icon to start the game.

Consult your manual for more information.

**NOTE: Terror T.R.A.X. may not run with Millions of colors (also known as True Color) settings.**

### Turning off Virtual Memory (Optional)

Terror T.R.A.X. works best when your virtual memory is turned off. To change this setting, follow these steps:

1. Under the Apple symbol on the far left, select Control Panel.
2. Choose the section Memory.
3. Under the Virtual Memory area, hit the 'off' radio button.
4. Close the window.

You can now play Terror T.R.A.X. by double-clicking on the icon.

### Disable your Screen Saver (Optional)

Screen savers may appear during Terror T.R.A.X. Disable your screen saver before playing Terror T.R.A.X.

If you have a special screen saver program you may use its control program to disable it.

In some Macintosh systems, the control for turning off your screen saver is located under the apple icon in the upper left hand corner of your screen in the section named 'Control Panel', or sometimes 'After Dark.' Check there for a radio button or option to turn off the screen saver.

Consult your screen saver documentation for information.
